Antelope Problem Is Worrying Idaho

Herds Increase Too Fast and Farmers See Crops Menaced

Butte, Idaho.—Idaho antelope are increasing so fast that the state game department is considering methods of reducing conditions against which farmers of Butte, Lemhi and Cassia counties are protesting.

The antelope problem is not as easily solved, game department officials pointed out, as are some other cases, since the antelope, by nature, and temperament is not fitted for the life of a hunted game animal. His curious nature causes him to pry into things, and an open season probably would result in the extermination of the Idaho antelope herd, according to E. Friedman, game warden. A hunt for antelope is almost anything butting in the breeze, will attract the antelope's attention and thereafter his only function is to graze the forest floor.

But in the last year the Idaho herds have grown from 4,500 adults to 4,900. This is a record for antelope then can be conveniently cared for in the territory concerned. So the antelope, having but slight regard for the rights of private property, have been invading farm fields and eating the crops. A fence in the country heightens the slightest interest for the antelope. They will be fed at the state expense until they can leave for themselves, then placed in the country between St. Anthony and Idaho, a great antelope range before the coming of the white man virtually exterminated.

The good wishes of autoists who have staged impromptu races with antelope go with Hamilton, since the motorist's rapid means will undoubtedly result in the death of the antelope. "I want to be present when Mr. Hamilton, aboard his horse, starts to round up a few fifty-mile-an-hour antelope," was the comment of one sportsman well acquainted with antelope.
