

A "Snowmobile" used in the Maritime Provinces

OWN in the Maritime Provinces shown in the accompanying illustration, is used by a lumber concern in the Maritime Provinces. It is set for a hard winter. Proof that it will get over the roads no matter how high the drifts may be is furnished by Captain Donald McMillan, the famous Arctic explorer, who was first to use a "snowmobile" in the Far North. With his Ford thus equipped he travelled nearly two thousand miles over ice on one expedition, at the rate of twenty-five miles an hour. ### A. W. MacKenzie Promoted

Mr. A. W. MacKenzie, a former assistant to Mr. T. Stewart Cooper in the Department of Agriculture Office here, has been appointed Superintendent of Agriculture and Colonization for the Canadian National Railways for the Maritimes with headquarters at Moncton, N. B.

Mr. MacKenzie, who will devote considerable attention to agriculture in the Maritimes on behalf of the railway company, is one of the best-known agriculturists in the Maritimes. A native of Hants County, he took his first two years of agriculture at the Nova Scotia Agricultural College at Truro, graduating with the degree of B.S.A. from Toronto University in 1923. In the meantime he had established a brilliant record with the Canadian forces in France during the war.

His first agricultural work was done with the Ontario Department of Agriculture as Assistant Agricultural Representative in several counties including Grey. Later he acted as Field Man for the Canadian Cooperative Wool Growers in Eastern Canada. In 1926 he joined the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture, and has since been in charge of agricultural extension work in Cumberland County, in which work he has been exceptionally successful. Early in 1929 Mr. MacKenzie took on the additional work of Secretary-Manager of the Maritime Winter Fair at Amherst. Mr. MacKenzie has also been Secretary of the Maritime Livestock Breeders Association.
