### Sunday School Lesson

February 2. Lesson V.—Putting God's Kingdom First—Matthew 6: 1-13.  
GOLDEN TEXT—Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.—Matthew 6: 33.

**ANALYSIS**  
I. PRAYING TO THE FATHER, vs. 5-13.  
II. LOVING THE FATHER, vs. 10-13.  
III. SEEKING HIS KINGDOM, vs. 21-33.

**THE FATHER**  
I. PRAYING TO THE FATHER, vs. 5-13.  
V. 5. The first four verses are devoted to the religious duty of praying. The second and third verses are devoted to the manner of prayer, showing that this is the most important of the outward acts of religion. No person who does not practice the art of prayer. Jesus warns them against hypocrisy. If people make a parade of their prayers in order to win the reputation of being religious, then they may receive the reward of human praise, but they do not get their reward from God.

V. 6. The second warning is against unreality. If people repeat a prayer without putting their heart or soul into it, hoping that this will be heard, they have a totally wrong conception of God. More specifically, imply that God is a hard, exacting ruler, demanding penance, but if God be our loving Father, pray must be a form of communion or conversation, in which a soul finds true delight.

V. 7. We do not need to pray in order to inform God of our wants. Prayer is the human side of communion with God. My desire to be happy depends on my own attitude and how honest it is to know him.

V. 8. Now begins the teaching of the more important part of the lesson, the Lord's Prayer. It is the most important of all prayers. It consists of seven petitions. The first three petitions are for the Father, while the remaining four are for the Kingdom of God. The nature of God's character and will. How different are the ways which lead to a worship of a mechanical God from those which lead to a worship of a living God. The assurance that God is Father and that God's interests must come first.

V. 9. The three petitions for the Kingdom of God are the heart of the lesson. They are the things which we should pray for most earnestly. The Kingdom of God is not a political or social system, but a spiritual reality. It is the rule of God in the hearts of men. **RECORD AMOUNT FOR CONSTRUCTION**  
Toronto.—Building and construction contracts awarded in Canada in 1923 totalled \$576,651,800, an increase over the 1922 total of \$104,619,200, the highest on record, according to McLean Building Reports, Ltd.  
Engineering contracts during the year under review accounted for 1,194, 650,000; business buildings, \$190,161, 700; residential buildings, \$128,901, 700; new factories and additions \$62, 968,840.  
The distribution of the contracts geographically shows the province of Ontario with a total of \$215,773,100 worth of construction work awarded in 1923. Quebec is in second place with \$157,771,600; the Prairie Provinces, \$101,500,000; British Columbia, \$51,425,000; and the Maritime Provinces, \$20,178,300.

### The Naval Parleys Big Broadcast

Most Extensive Broadcast Ever Attempted in History of Radio

**HOW IT WAS DONE**  
The Canadian Marconi Company, through its short-wave beam receiving station at Yamachiche, Quebec, picked up the joint short-wave trans-Atlantic signals of the British Broadcasting Company and the English Postoffice Department. From Yamachiche the land lines of the Bell Telephone Company of Canada took the broadcast to Montreal, where it was placed on the Canadian National Telegraph lines for distribution throughout Canada and to Station CFCF in Montreal of the Canadian National Company.

**Use Carrier Current System**  
The carrier current system of the Canadian National Telegraph carried the broadcast from coast to coast. For the first time since the special-direction jumbo broadcast of 1927 there was a continuous chain from Halifax to Vancouver. From CFCF to CNRV the 3,600-mile expanse of Canada was tied together by nearly 15,000 miles of wire, enabling even the farthest north listeners in Canada, those above the Arctic Circle to within 500 miles of the North Pole, to hear the opening message of the London conference by King George.

The hub of stations for this big chain consisted of the regular Canadian National Railway network of thirteen stations and those stations which have from time to time been allied with this largest of Canadian networks.

The primary stations of the chain tied in Vancouver, Calgary, Regina, Edmonton, Saskatoon, Regina, Montreal, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal, New Brunswick, Moncton, Nova Scotia, Halifax and Charlottetown, and White Bay, in Ontario, in Manitoba, and others scattered in the north.

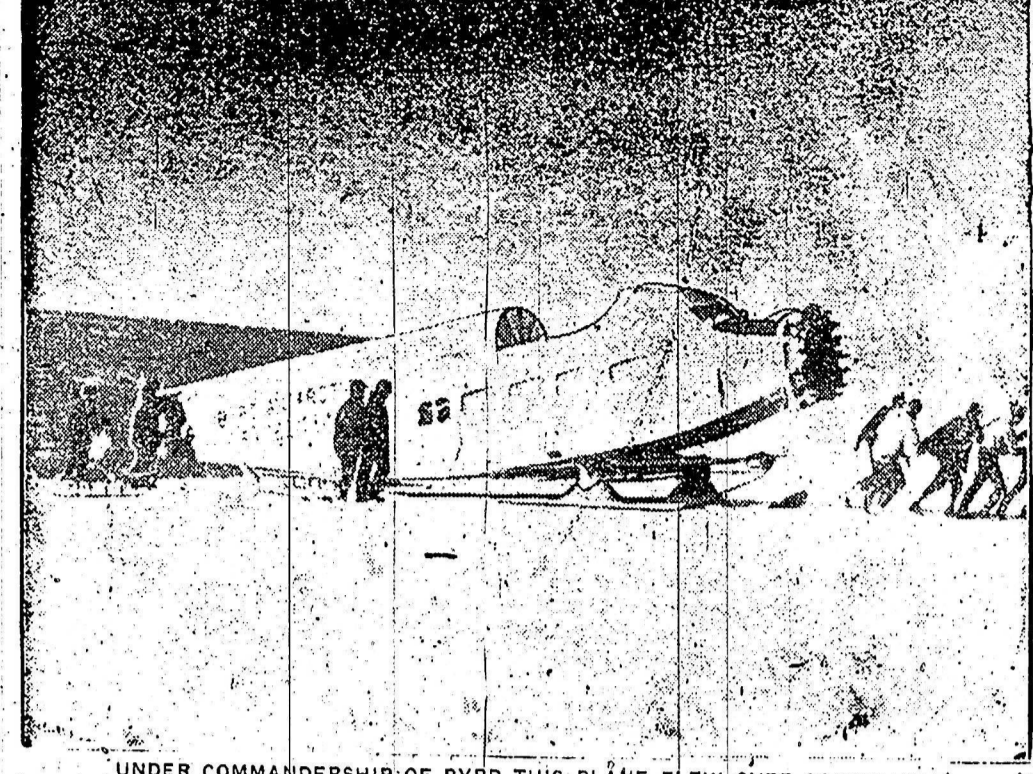

UNDER COMMANDERSHIP OF BYRD THIS PLANE FLEW OVER SOUTH POLE

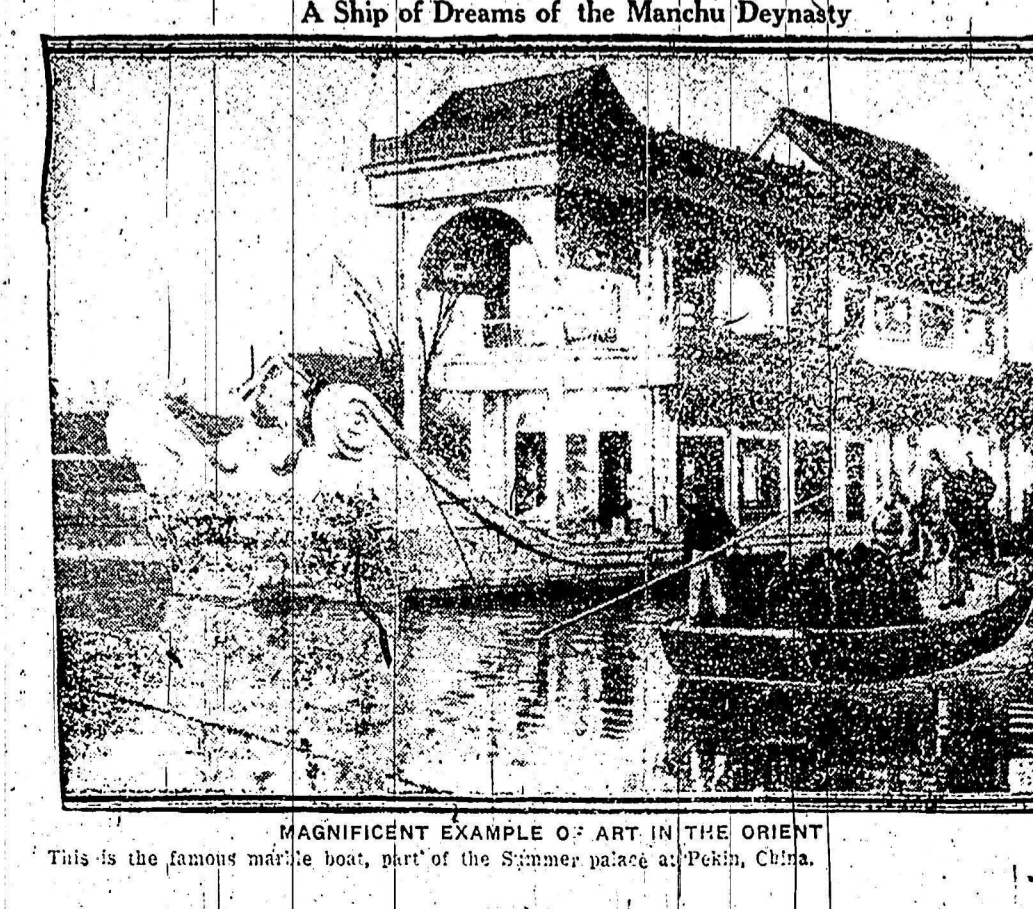
Pushover, a Ford plane, Floyd Bennett, which flew to South Pole, being hoisted from edge of ice barrier to headquarters of expedition at Little America.

### Strange Antics Of Chinese Officials

Kuomintang Will Admit Aliens as Members After They Pass a Rigorous Examination

Shanghai.—The Kuomintang political organization which controls the Nanking Government, has decided to admit foreigners to its membership, but only under certain specified conditions and only after a rigorous examination.

The organization department of the Central party headquarters at Nanking has long had this step in mind. It has been drawing up the regulations for some time. Before being admitted to the membership a foreigner must pledge himself to abide by the regulations and orders of the party. He must also prepare a written record of his entire previous career, submit this to the special management headquarters of the city in which he resides. Foreigners living outside China may join the Kuomintang if they submit their written record to the nearest overseas headquarters.

In addition, all candidates will be required to answer and swear to their own long written questionnaire. This will include the applicant's occupation, his income, his knowledge of Chinese language and of the situation here, and his opinion as to the relations between his country and the Government of China.
