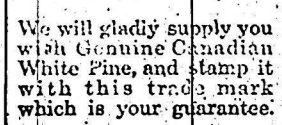

Markdale 6 - O. S. Falcons 2

Markdale team chartered a special train to take their supporters over to Durham to see the death game ordered to be played by the N.H.L. Executive between the local entry and the Owen Sound Falcons, and the 200 fans got their money's worth in watching two fast junior teams in action. The Markdale Juniors proved that the two previous victories over the Falcons were no flukes, as they gave the Falcons a 6-2 drubbing and proved that they were a better conditioned, faster and brainier team. When the teams went on the ice the well filled rink settled down to see two good junior teams battle over the 60 minute rope, but after the first period Markdale's superiority was easily noticed.

The first period started with Owen Sound, doing most of the puck carrying, and the Markdale team holding themselves in waiting for the Falcons to tire. The period ended with the score 1 goal to nothing in favor of Markdale, MacFarlane getting the counter.

The second period opened with Markdale letting out a few wraps and on a nice play Johnston carried the puck through the entire Owen Sound team and passed to Woods who made no mistake but bulged the twine for the second goal, giving Tennant no chance. Owen Sound then got their first goal on a combination play. Not to be outdone, Johnston again repeated his former play and Woods again made good. Markdale scored again but it was ruled offside. This ended the second period.

When the teams came on the ice to start the grand final the crowd got to their feet and from then to the end never had a chance to sit down. The Falcons scored what looked to be a purely offside goal which was allowed by the referee to make it 3-2. From then on there was nothing to the game with Markdale having all the play. Woods was skating rings around the whole Owen Sound team, and on an unassisted play put Markdale up another goal. MacFarlane, who was playing in the first period, gave the Owen Sound team a goal in the third period.

The game was well refereed by Bobbie Saunders of Durham, who handed out ten penalties, 7 going to Owen Sound, with Stick and Couture being the bad men, and three to Markdale. After the game Manager Bellamy and his players congratulated the Markdale players and admitted that the better team had won. The Tennant brothers and Campbell were the best for Owen Sound, although if Campbell did not loaf so much he would be more effective. The Markdale team played an excellent brand of hockey. Wright in goal was 'right' there and made some wonderful saves and was not to blame for the two shots which beat him. Johnston and Nuhn were good both defensively and offensively, their rushes being one of the features of the game. The MacFarlane brothers and Woods made one sweet forward line, being superior to their opponents, with Woods the outstanding player on the ice. Percy Wright and Milt Perkins played good hockey when on the ice.

Markdale 3 - Paisley 0

Among the sick of our village are Mrs. George McTavish, Mrs. Gilchrist, Mrs. Miller and little daughter, Marion.

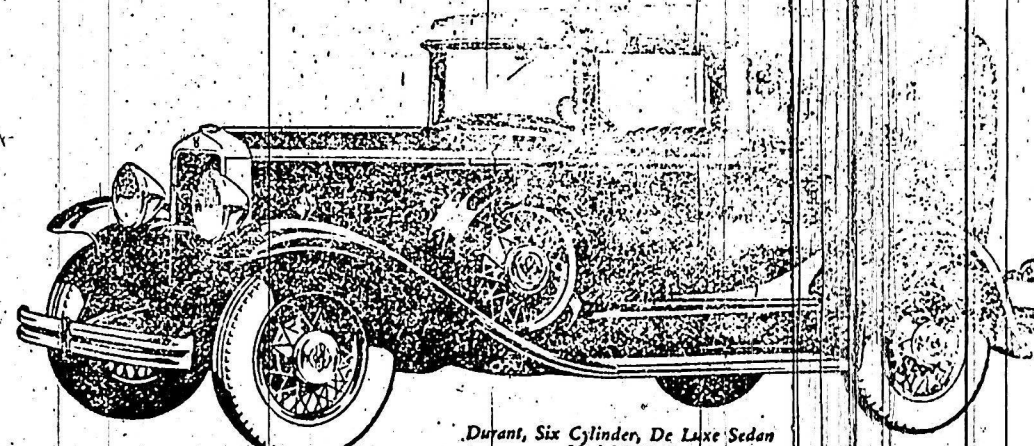
