Some of the chief causes of these deaths, according to the Dominio Bureau of Statistics, are: Premature Births and Injuries at Birth-5,586; Piarrhoen, Dysentery and Diseases o the Stomach-4.144; Congenital Malformations and Disabilities-3,634; bronchitis and Pneumonia-2,334; and other Communicable Diseases-

1:459. Lack of knowledge, or ignorance definitely contributed to the death of 50 per cent, of these children; this ignorance was evidenced by the lack of antenatal service, lack of satisfac tery medican and nursing care at the time of, and following birth, and by

In ,co-operation with the Federal Provincial Departments Health, the Canadian Council on Child Welfare is making an effort to try to reduce this tremendous loss of life in Canada. 
