Oil Age Gives New Speed,

Montreal-The modern era is distinguished from all others by man's use of the products made from crude oil, and hence this is the "Oil Age," according to Stephen Leacock, lecturer and professor of political economy to their buiness." at McGill University here.

Petroleum was known for centuries. Leacock says, but the modern uses for it were not discovered until nineteenth century. Modern scientists, while they agree with Mr. Leacock in recognizing the discovery of oil and its importance as a basic product, stress man's ingenuity in perfecting methods of scientific refining, and attach secondary significance to the quality of the crude as it comes from the ground.

Beebe Returns With

New Fish Specimens 'New York-Dr. William Beebe. director of tropical research for the New York "oological Society, returned recently from his second consecued recently from his second consecu-tive year of studying fish in the ocean-depths off Nonsuch Island, near Ber-High hyslop, thanford, Ontario. muda. He brought 94 cases containing about 150,000 specimens of fish and crustaceans, many of them new to science and some trawled at a depth of two miles. He intends to name
