Rules Regarding Christmas Parcels To U.S. Points Parcel Rates-Parcels weighing 8 ounces or less-1 cent per ounce; parcels over 8 ounces not exceeding 15 pounds, 14 cents per pound or

fraction thereof. Customs Declarations-For parcels weighing eight ounces or less a Customs Declaration invoice should

be ENCLOSED. For parcels weighing over 8 ounces Customs Delaration should be AF-

Eqr packages prepaid at printed matter rate or letter rate an invoice should be ENCLOSED. No Customs Declarations are required for such packages and should not be AFFIX-

During the Christmas season there is an unusual parcel congestion at United States Custom points: To ensure delivery before Christmas, parcels for the United States should be mailed NOT LATER THAN THE FIRST WEEK IN DECEMBER.


