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**Shaw Says Pidgin English Will Be Future Language**

Letchworth, England—"Pidgin English will be the classic English of the future," George Bernard Shaw said in a speech at the celebration of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the founding of the Letchworth Library.

"An Englishman says: 'I am sorry I cannot oblige you.' Shaw said, 'but a Chinaman says: 'No can', and expresses himself perfectly."

Shaw took exception, ironically, to the Biblical reference to the "blessedness" of the poor. "Until this country becomes determined that it shall never again have a poor man, woman or child in it," he said, "it won't be a country worth living in."

Speaking of libraries and books, Shaw said that it was the British Museum library that had made him a

Communist. "And I'll live and die a Communist," he added.

"Books," he said, "had been valuable to him in the study of speech. 'If you made me king of England,' he said, 'I might fall short of the ideal in many ways, but you wouldn't object to me on the ground that my speech was disgraceful. If you made me Archbishop of Canterbury I could get away with the talking part. If you made me Lord Chief Justice I could sentence you to death in a way that would do honor to the occasion. But the most fluent person in his own language is often helpless if he crosses a frontier. I'm a great man here. But when I get on the other side of the Channel I'm less than any porter."

**Annual Forest Leaf Fall Estimated at Ton an Acre**

Washington.—The blanket of leaves from one year's leaf fall in the forest may weigh more than a ton per acre, the United States Department of Agriculture says. Forest Service investigators find that a heavy litter is capable of holding vast amounts of water and slowing up the run-off which, without the protection blanket, would quickly erode the soil of the woodlands.

In studying the protective value of leaf litter and the result of its removal by fire or other agency, Forest Service investigators found that the 1930 fall of dry leaves, gathered up on a half acre of pine-oak forest at the Bent Creek Experimental Forest near Asheville, N.C., weighed 1,300 pounds, oven-dry-weight. Accumulated dry leaves and litter on the tract previous to the first clean-up weighed 6½ tons to the acre, dry weight.


From two to three years are required for decomposition of the litter, and a heavy blanket of leaves is thus normally present on the area. As a consequence of removal of the ground cover for this study, erosion set in on the area, although the rainfall was unusually slight. Soil loss was also hastened when winter frosts heaved and loosened the unprotected soil, making it wash easily later on.

Radio Short-Waves Stop Food Decay Dairyman's Invention Shows

Soest, Holland.—A discovery has been made, writes a special correspondent in The Christian Science Monitor, in the field of ultra short-wave radio research whereby decay in foodstuffs is absolutely arrested, according to Robert Pape of Soest, Holland, who has been for many years active in the dairy industry.

The invention, put briefly, consists of an apparatus which generates ultra short waves in the region of 25 centimeters to 1 meter. The waves thus generated form, after about 10 days and within a radius of 20 meters from the machine, an electro-magnetic field, in which no organic product can decompose. The size of this electro-magnetic field is, practically speaking, a globe of about 30,000 cubic meters.

The preserving action of this field penetrates through everything: stone walls, iron, lead, wood, glass and so forth indoors and outdoors, in any atmosphere or temperature.

The cold storage field, which has developed to such a grade of perfection, is said to be highly interested in the new invention. For this new machine, which occupies a space of a few cubic meters and thereby forms a food preserving field of 30,000 cubic meters, uses up only as much electricity as an ordinary 200 candle power electric bulb and the results of this small device are declared to be far better than those of a modern equipped cold storage warehouse, with its expensive machinery.

The invention, which was received at first with incredulity, has lately caused a great deal of interest, natural scientists both from here and abroad pouring into Mr. Pape's bungalow here, where he is demonstrating the machine.

The correspondent of The Christian Science Monitor has seen food on plates in various parts of the house, in the garret and in the garden, perfectly odorless and undecayed, which had been there for months. There were new potatoes of June, 1930, a little bit discolored, but which could still easily be scraped. There were eggs, broken on a plate, several months ago, a little dried, but not a sign of decay. Eggs in the shell stored in the house on May 23, 1930, were opened and the yolk was beautifully yellow and without odor.

Reports of experiments by outsiders have been published, among them one of Dr. A. Van Raalte, chief of the Amsterdam Meat Inspection Service, on behalf of the Dutch Patent Council.

From these reports it appeared that the acid percentage of milk which had been kept for a fortnight in the electromagnetic field had not increased; that pears, after a number of months, had maintained all the qualities they possessed when placed in the field, and that shrimps, mixed with only 4 per cent. of salt, showed no ammonia development after a fortnight's exposure.

**Autos Now Navigate Deepest Rivers**

Floating automobiles that run on roads in the ordinary way, but are able when necessary to float across rivers, have been built and tested for use in a traveling exhibition of British industries proposed by Capt. Geoffrey Mallins of London. Says Dr. E. E. Price in his Week's Science (New York):

"Attached to the side of each automobile are frames and brackets made of the new light metal called 'electrum', an alloy of magnesium, less than one-half the weight of aluminum.

"Fastened to these brackets are eight air bags of rubberized fabric, four for each side of the car.

"When the expedition wishes to cross a bridgeless river, the electron framework is put in place, the air bags are attached, and these are pumped up by a bellows arrangement operated by the engine. The car then may be driven into the water under its own power and float on the air bags, with its running-boards level with the water surface.

**Care in Raising Chicks**

Visitors to the Silver Maple Poultry Farm at Westport, N.Y., find several pairs of rubber overshoes in a box near the walks that lead to the brooder houses. The rubbers must be worn by the poultrymen and, as an added precaution, it is necessary for the wearer to step in a box containing a disinfectant before entering the brooder house, according to Ira J. Hollar of the New York State College of Agriculture.

The brooder houses are swept, scraped, scrubbed with lye and water, disinfected with a 5 per cent. coal-tar disinfectant, and then a fire torch was used on the floors and walls before placing the chicks in the house. The brooding equipment had the same treatment.

Mr. Robert Gray, manager of the farm, has had experience with losses of chicks, of mature pullets and in fewer eggs from coccidiosis, and has outlined strict sanitation practices to avoid further outbreaks. After the chicks are placed in the brooder house, fresh litter is placed under the hover daily and all litter is changed every five days. When the litter is changed a torch is used to dry the floor and destroy any coccidiosis germs which may be present.

The chicks are fed an all-mash ration regularly at 8 o'clock in the morning, at noon and at 4 o'clock in the afternoon. Dr. Gray plans that the chicks be without feed at least an hour between feeds so the chicks' intestines may have a short rest period.
