Berlin.—German radio users increased by 500,000 in 1931, bringing the present total to close to 4,000,000. according to the annual report of the Federai Postoffice, which also man-ages Germany's telegraph, telephone and wireless services. Every radio must be licensed, the subscriber pay-ing 50c a month. About 275,000 subscribers, however, were relieved of even this small fee. They are war eripples, the blind, hospitals and unemployed persons.

The Postal Banking Department also shows an increase in the number of accounts—1,014,000, against 992, 356 in 1930—but a decrease of \$4, 500,000 in the volume of business which amounted to \$30,000,000.

Finds Infected Mice Live Longer if Kept on Move

Miss Katherine Watson, graduate tudent of New York University, who for the last seven weeks has been experimenting with 180 pedigreed mice, announced recently that the re-sults of her experiment indicated that increased activity on the part of a rodent gave it greater resistance to infection. Although only six of the mice are still alive Miss Watson believes that those which were kept active after the injection of pneumococcus germs resisted pneumonia better than those which were seden-

Miss Watson is not ready to apply any of the results of her experiment to human beings, would "like it very much it some doctor would try a similar experiment with human beings in the re-sistance to colds."

The experiment will not be tried again, said Miss Watson, who will become a teacher of physical education after she receives her doctor's degree. She said she had become fond of the mice, one of which she had planned to save as a pet, but which died after being innoculated




