Goethe's Ancestry Sangerhausen, Germany.—The com-ing of the "Goethe year" of 1932 which brings on March 22 the 100th anniversary of the German poet's death, has given new impetus to research concerning his life and family

Up to a few years ago the oldest known ancestor of Goethe's was his great-grandfather, the blacksmith Hans Christian Goethe, who lived in Artern, in the Province of Saxony, then the great-great-grandfather was discovered in the person of Hans Goethe, of Sangerhausen, in the Harz, but he could be traced back only to 1671. Friedrich Schmidt, author of a history of Sangerhausen, has now succeeded in establishing that Hans Goethe was born in Berka, near Sonderhausen, also in the Harz, and that he was registered as a citizen of Sangerhausen in 1657.


