Don't judge by results" is a mighty other eards. Learn to analyze the good slogan and one that should be rations hands that come up for disapplied at all times. Most players are apt to judge by results at Auction or Contract, rather than by analysis, and there is nothing more harmful if a player really and sincerely wishes to improve his game. Sound bidding is based on probabilities, not upon certainties. If you or any player at the table fails to make his bid, analyze the hand before deciding whether the bid was good or bad. Be sure of your facts before you criticize.

Many a bid that is defeated several tricks sares a game or rubber and may, therefore, have been perfectly justifiable. Anything can happen to a hand, even to the strongest. There is practically no hand that you will ever hold which on a high bid cannot be defeated, by a freak distribution of the Hand Nc. 1
