Notes From Paris

Oversupply of Taxis
The examination of the vehicles brought to a standstill by a traffic jam at any point in central Paris will reveal the fact that, at least half of them are empty taxicabs. In reply to inquiry made by M. Robert Ros, a municipal councillor, M. Chiappe, the prefect of police, states that more than 50,000 licenses for taxi driving have been issued. Only about 30,000 taxi drivers exercise their profession, but this number is still far in excess of the actual demand for taxis.

Concerts for Unemployed
Every Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock, the French branch of the Young Women's Christian Association provides a concert for women and girls who are temporarily out of work. These concerts are organized with the help of some of the most prominent artists in Paris and are designed to give encouragement and rest to the unemployed in their search for work.

French Artists Also Barter
At an exposition recently held at the Porte de Versailles, the arts exhibiting found a novel way of disposing of their work. They reverted to the old custom of barter. Though they never refused money for their pictures if it was offered them, they were open to exchange them for certain commodities. Naturally, the would-be purchasers did not come with bunches of carrots, some fresh fish, brown and crusty loaves of bread, or one or two suits of clothes. This was how things were done: When the artist had satisfied himself that the purchaser was what he claimed to be, a grocer, fishmonger, baker, or tailor, as the case may have been, the price of the picture was agreed upon and the customer gave the artist a bill on himself for goods to the value of that amount.

Skyscrapers For Paris?
Are skyscrapers to be allowed in Paris? This much-discussed question has come up again. It appears that the Paris Municipal Council wishes what used to be known as the "Porte" Mallot to be one of the main entrances to the city, and with this end in view has approached M. Rosenthal, the owner of some property situated there, and asked him whether he would part with a portion of his land and allow a skyscraper to be built thereon. Until now, the Municipal Council has consistently vetoed any suggestion to build such a thing as a skyscraper. It has fixed the maximum height that a building may attain at approximately 99 feet. Parisians are asking whether this regulation is to be changed, and skyscrapers are to be allowed. — The Christian Science Monitor.

Coffee Output in Cuba Shows Steady Gain

Havana—The steady increase of coffee growing in Cuba will soon eliminate importations and will, within the next few years, permit exportation, according to a report just issued by the Department of Agriculture. During 1931 Cuba produced 59,486,500 pounds of coffee, with a value of \$6,543,516, which is an increase of 7,623,600 pounds over the 1930 yield.

The entire coffee industry of Cuba is concentrated in the Province of Oriente, at the extreme eastern end of the island, where, the report states, 145,431 acres are in cultivation, with an average production of some 500 pounds to the acre. The industry now provides employment to 28,214 persons.

How to play Bridge AUCTION and CONTRACT

by Wynne Ferguson Author of "PRACTICAL AUCTION BRIDGE"

Probably the most difficult thing for a player to decide is when to bid, and frequently the player will hold a hand that requires some thinking before making a bid. Sometimes you hold cards that would justify a bid from you if you knew the cards in your partner's hand, but as you are not a mind reader and your hand does not contain a thoroughly sound original bid, the best thing for you to do is to pass. Bridge is a game of high cards, aces and kings, and if you have no ace or king, no matter what other cards you hold, you should pass if it is your turn to open the bidding. If you have an ace or king and three other small cards of one suit, it is advisable to bid that suit once. It isn't much of a hand of course, but your partner must have something to shoot at. You must tell him something about your hand. You are playing a partnership game and it is your duty and part of your contract to inform your partner at your earliest opportunity of the nature of your hand.

It is perfectly safe to assume that nearly all the best players play alike. There is very little difference in the play of the best players and the bidding therefore is doubly important. Make sound bids originally or pass. There is no middle course here. The original bid must have a meaning and if you bid originally without high cards, without aces and kings, and without a trump over the two spades, your bid is misleading and is known and recognized as the Boob Bid. Practically all Auction and Contract players who have played these games for any length of time realize that it is bad policy to make a bid with a hand that is too weak to justify the bid. They realize that such bids are unsound but cannot seem to resist the temptation to bid. Their theory seems to be that the dealer runs no risk by making a weak bid because his opponents will pass.

Hearts—10, 4 Clubs—K, 8, 3 Spades—K, Q, 8, 3 Diamonds—K, Q, 10, 7
No score, rubber game. Z dealt and bid one spade. A two diamonds, Y two spades and B passed. What should Z now bid with the foregoing hand and why, at either Auction or Contract? In the opinion of the writer, Z should now bid two no trump over the two spades. He knows that his spade bid is a four-card bid and that only very good support by his partner will enable him to score game. He also knows that he has a double stopper in the diamond suit which will probably be opened at no trump. For these reasons, it looks like a better chance to score game at no trump than at spades. The following are the hands held by all four players:

Hearts—9, 7, 5 Clubs—Q, 10, 9, 7, 2 Diamonds—10, 8, 7 Spades—A, 4
Hearts—A, 8, 2 Clubs—J Diamonds—A, J, 9, 6, 5, 2 Spades—8, 6, 3
Hearts—10, 4 Clubs—K, 8, 3 Spades—K, Q, 10, 7
give B a ruff. B should now lead another club and give A another ruff. They now will make the ace of hearts so that Y Z can only make one odd at spades. It is a good example of clever inferential bidding and the good results obtainable therefrom.

Activity in Great Bear Lake Region

According to reports reaching Ottawa a great many mineral claims have already been staked in the area adjacent to Great Bear Lake, Northwest Territories, and there is every likelihood that many more will be staked this summer. Some prospectors have already gone in by airplane and others are planning to go in by water transport as soon as the ice goes out. In view of this great activity the Topographical Survey, Department of the Interior, Ottawa, has reprinted the manual respecting the survey of mineral claims in Dominion Lands for the use of Dominion Land surveyors who may be called upon to make official surveys of these claims.

Saving Canada's Antelope

The history of Nemiskam National Park, Alberta, Canada, is an interesting chapter in the story of wild life conservation. Over-coming what appeared to be insurmountable difficulties, forty-two antelope were enclosed in a fenced-in area in southern Alberta in 1915, and, in contrast to previous experiments, continued to thrive in captivity. Their welfare and propagation, which at first was a matter of speculation, now seem to be definitely assured, as officials of the National Parks of Canada, Department of the Interior, report that the herd now totals 425.

B.C. Sheep Ranches

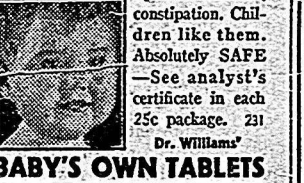
An interesting financial summary of 20 British Columbia sheep ranches is given by the Economic Analyst. These ranches are all located in the southern interior of the province, where the high rolling plateau with numerous valleys and the variable climate are especially adapted to sheep raising. The ranchers, it is said, average a net return of 7.77 cents per pound for lambs sold, and 8.03 cents per pound for wool. The capital invested in the sheep ranching business yielded 1.7% interest in 1930. Receipts averaged \$7.50 and expenses \$6.55 per head, leaving a ranch income of \$1.05 per head. Estimates by operators place their labor cost at 60 cents per head, leaving a return of 45 cents to capital. Without carefully analyzing the facts obtained by this survey, it might be concluded that these ranches had been run at a loss. Among the items of expense, however, are family labor and depreciation which are not necessarily paid in cash. The same applies to interest on capital invested, and allowance for operator's services. Both though must be charged to the business. It should be noted also that at present very little goes to meet such non-cash items as depreciation on machinery and buildings. — Toronto Mail and Empire.
