Shows Steady Gain Havana—The steady increase of offee growing in Cuba will soon eliminate importations and will, within the next few years, permit exportation, according to a report just is sued by the Department of Agriculture. During 1931 Cuba produced 59,486,500 pounds of coffee, with a value of \$6,543,516, which is an increase of 7.623,600 pounds over the 1930 vield.

The entire coffee industry of Cuba is concentrated in the Province of Oriente, at the extreme eastern end of the island, where, the report states, 145,431 acres are in cultivation, with an average production of some 500 pounds to the acre. The industry now provides employment to 28,214 persons.
