SWINE PRODUCERS MEET

The Township Directors of the Grey County Branch of the Ontario Swine Producers met in the Department of Agriculture, Markdale, recently. Quite a large percentage of the men were present.

The chief object of the meeting was the selection of officers; and the Grey County Representative, who should meet on the Provincial Board at subsequent meetings.

The following is the result of the election of officers: President, Geo. McDonald, Owen Sound, R. R. No. 1; Vice Pres., Burton Carefoot, Clarksburg, R. R. No. 2; Sec'y-Treas., T. Stewart Cooper, Markdale; Committee, Geo. Ross, Maxwell, Alfred Weppeler, Pricerville; Director to Provincial Association, Geo. Bothwell.

Many plans were formulated, and considerable discussion as to the methods of assistance which should be undertaken was indulged in. Real results are anticipated.

The objects of the Association are as follows:

1. To encourage the production of high quality market hogs.
2. To endeavour to stabilize production and marketing on a more even basis throughout the year, and over a period of years.
3. To promote better marketing conditions.
4. To effect improved transportation facilities and more equitable freight rates on feed stuffs.
5. To issue a publication from time to time that will contain information of value to members.
6. To co-operate with the Federal

and Provincial Governments for the purpose of effecting legislation beneficial to the swine producer.

7. To co-operate with similar organizations that may be formed in other provinces or any Federal organization that may be formed for the general good of the swine industry.

8. To assist wherever possible in improving swine conditions generally.

WEED INSPECTORS MEET

On May 31st, the Reeves, Deputy Reeves, Weed Inspectors and Road Superintendents held an all day meeting at the Department of Agriculture. It was one of the largest meetings held in Ontario in 1934.

The morning session was addressed by Mr. A. R. G. Smith of New Hamburg, District Weed Inspector of Western Ontario. He interpreted the Weed Act and showed that Weed Inspectors could advise the Highway Department of any eradicating of weed cutting, who could in turn withhold the Highway Grant till assurance of a clean up was given.

Mr. A. H. Martin, B.S.A., Assistant Director of the Crops Co-operation and Markets Branch, took charge in the afternoon. He showed lantern slides of many weeds which would enable the Weed Inspectors to identify any menacing plants in their communities.

The meeting, largely attended by representatives from the majority of the municipalities, was one of the most gratifying to Mr. Martin and Mr. Smith. They left with the

assurance that weeds would be eliminated to a greater extent in Grey County during 1934.

Miss Dora Boland gave a splendid report of the Girls' Conference held at Guelph, to which she was a delegate.

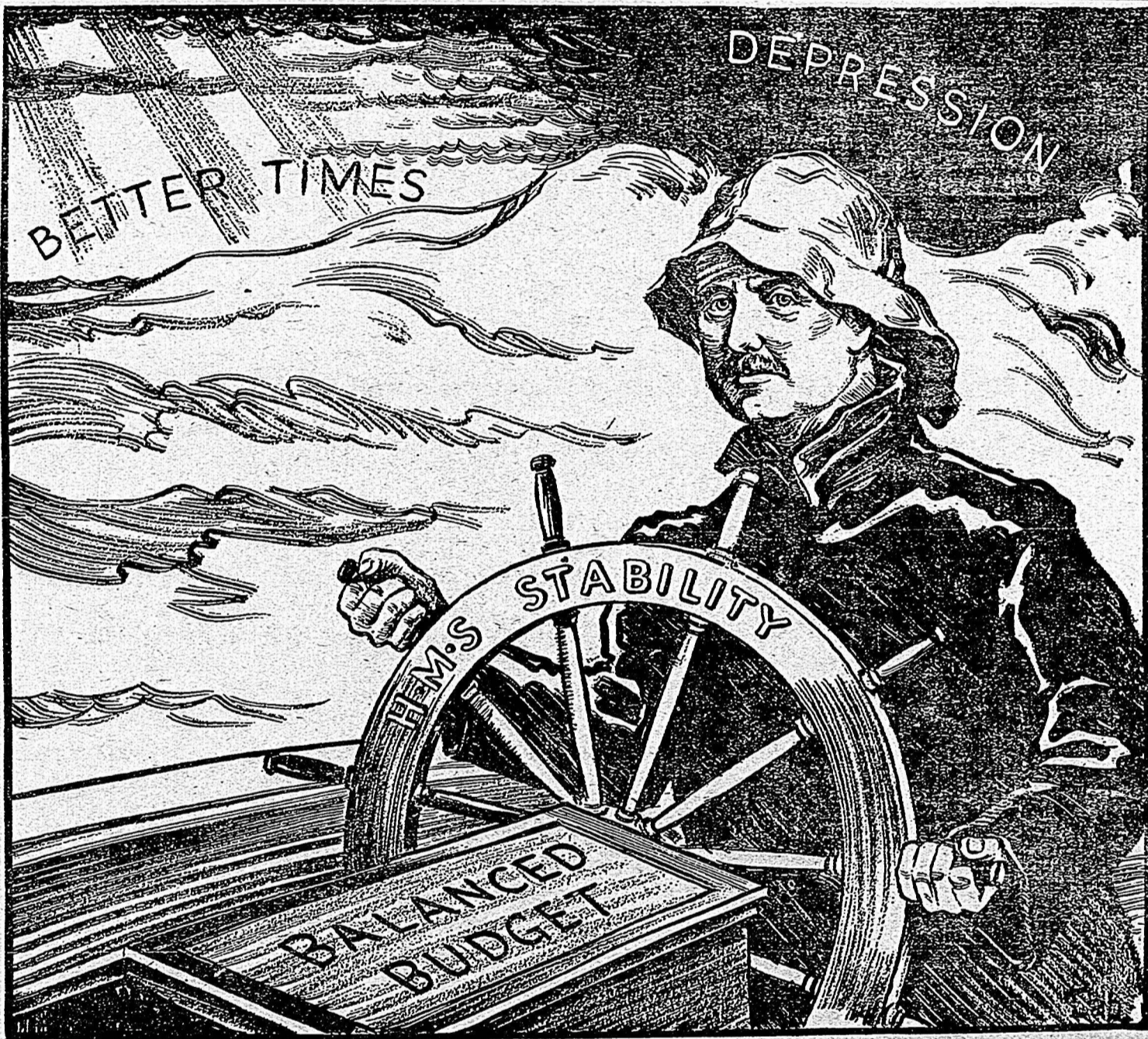
Mrs. H. Knight and Mrs. W. J. Hutchinson were put in as delegates to go to District meeting to be held at Kimberley in June.
