HOLLAND COUNCIL

Holland, May 1st, 1934.
Council met on above date for transaction of Township business, with all the members present, John Heighes, Esq., Reeve, presiding. Minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed.
The following were then read: communication from Alex. Young, asking assistance; account from General and Marine hospital for Mrs. E. Skinner, Holland's share, \$48.82; letter from Wm. Hampton, Treasurer, tendering his resignation owing to ill health.
The Consolidated Insurance Co. asked for renewal of contract.
Hanna - Carbert—That the Clerk be instructed to write Mr. Alex. Young that no action will be taken regarding relief.—Carried.
Carbert - Hanna—That hospital bill for Mrs. E. Skinner and babe for \$48.82 be paid to the County Treasurer.—Carried.
Hanna - Howey—That we insure in the Consolidated Insurance Co. from May 25th, 1934 to May 25th, 1935 for the sum of \$165.00.—Carried.
Hanna - Price—That we regretfully accept the resignation of our esteemed Treasurer and that the Clerk convey to him the best wishes of this Council and hope for a speedy recovery, his resignation to take effect when his successor is appointed.—Carried.
Hanna - Howey—That John Price and the Road Superintendent be a committee to try and buy two graders from the Dept. of Highways.—Carried.
Carbert - Hanna—That the taxes on the following lots be erased: lot 17, con. 3, E.G.R.; E. pt. lot 2, con. 3; lots 68, 69, con. 3, W.T.S.R.—Carried.
Price - Hanna—That a by-law providing for a reduction in the term of subsisting contracts for the supply of electric service in rural power districts of which this township or any portion thereof form a part, from twenty years to five years be now introduced.—Carried.
By-Law introduced. read a first time and numbered 19.
Hanna - Carbert—That By-Law No. 19 be now read a second time.
By-Law No. 19 was read accordingly.
Hanna - Carbert—That By-Law No. 19 be now read the third time, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and engrossed in the By-Law book.—Carried.
By-Law No. 19 was read and passed accordingly.
Howey - Hanna—That the Road Superintendent's pay sheet No. 2 for \$494.58 be paid and Treasurer be ordered to issue cheques for the same.—Carried.
Mr. Howey presented Report No. 5 of Finance Committee recommending payment of \$71.00.
Price - Carbert—That Report No. 5 of Finance Committee be adopted as read.—Carried.
Hanna - Price—That the Clerk be instructed to ask for applications for Treasurer for the Township. Applicants to furnish bonds to the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars or bond furnished by the Township for the same amount. No application necessarily accepted. All applications to be sent to the Clerk on or before the first day of June, 1934.—Carried.
Howey - Price—That this Council now adjourn till June 5th 4 o'clock a.m.—Carried.
Council then adjourned.
