COUNTY COUNCIL

The sessions of Grey County Council held in Owen Sound last week were presided over by Warden W. L. Taylor, Reeve of Osprey.

The County Roads Committee reported having undertaken considerable work under the relief scheme, including cutting the hills and constructing a bridge at the Saugeen river at Cherry Grove. The members of this committee were paid \$461.10 for their services.

The Finance Committee recommended payment of hospital accounts amounting to \$3218.50. The equalized assessment of the several municipalities in the county was fixed as in 1933. The County rate was struck at 5 1/2 mills on the dollar, with one mill extra for County road purposes and three quarters of a mill for Provincial Highways.

The County Property recommended payment for repairs and supplies amounting to \$879.20.

\$2305.46 was paid to High Schools outside the County for maintenance of county pupils.
