By Dunn & Leveck Supplies of cattle have been in keeping with the present demand, and some improvement is shown in prices on most classes.

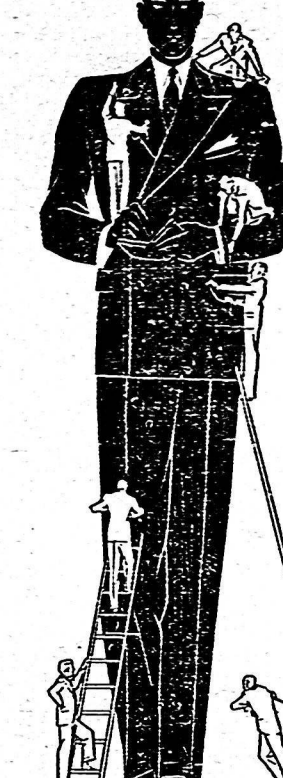
