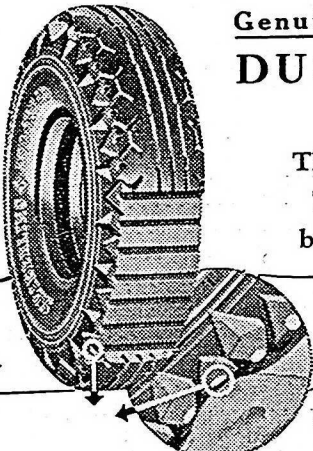

#### ARTEMESIA COUNCIL

Artemesia Council met as a Court of Revision on the 1935 assessment with the members all present. The Reeve was appointed chairman and the following appeals were heard and determined: John Hargrave, confirmed; Robt. Ferris, reduced \$75 because buildings removed; Stanley Lyons, reduced \$750; Thos. Currie, reduced \$200; Leonard Alcox, confirmed; H. B. Jackson, confirmed; Geo. Littlejohns, dog struck off, and some other minor changes made. Meldrum - Purvis—That roll as revised be the assessment roll for all purposes for 1935, subject to any changes made by the County Judge on appeal to him. The Court then adjourned.

After the Court of Revision the Council met for general business. The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

The following accounts were ordered to be paid: Municipal World, forms, 67 cents; The Assessor, for equalizing union school sections, \$15.00; The Treasurer, attending at County Treasurer's office, \$9.00; J. McBeth, tile, \$5.00; F. Duncan, for mails, \$1.60; Dever Bros., oil, 60c; W. Nicholls, grading, \$3.50; L. McCracken, repairs to grader, \$2.50.

The County Treasurer was requested to erase arrears of taxes from a number of lots which have been returned to him.

Road payments were made as follows: Div. 1, \$19.97; Div. 2, \$134.59; Div. 3, \$5.75; Div. 4, \$45.11; Div. 5, \$14.63.

Sheep claims were paid as follows: A. Cameron, \$8.00; A. Stewart, \$11.00; John Campbell, valuing, \$1.00.

The Fenceviewers were paid \$2.00 re arbitration of Sargent vs Kennedy and the same will be placed on the Collector's roll for 1935.

Appropriations for road expenditures were made as follows: Div. 1, \$300; Div. 2, \$300; Div. 3, \$300; Div. 4, \$300; Div. 5, \$150; 190 side-road, \$75.

Council then adjourned.

#### HOLLAND COUNCIL

The Court of Revision for Holland Township was held on June 4 when the members of Council were all present and took the oath.

The following appeals were then considered: Wm. McClarty, E½ lot 6, con. 7; Wm. I. Hearst, west part lot 78, con. 1, E.T.S.R.

After due consideration it was moved by J. S. Price, seconded by G. Hanna, and adopted, that the value of the Assessor of E½ lot 6, con. 7, and west part lot 78, con. 1, E.T.S.R., be sustained, and that 12 acres of the west part of lot 28, con. 6, be transferred from the assessment of Wm. Sowerby to that of John Sowerby at the Assessor's valuation. The Court then adjourned.

Following the Court of Revision the Council met with the members all present and the Reeve, John Heighes, Esq., presiding.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

The following were then read: A report of Wellington Beirnes, sheep valuer, valuing four lambs belonging to Wm. Smith which had been worried by dogs; account of John A. Kirk, equalizing assessment of Separate School No. 3, Glenelg, Sullivan, Holland and Bentinck, \$5.00.

Howey - Carbert—That the Clerk authorize the County Treasurer to erase all taxes from his books appearing against lots 78, 79, 80, 81, con. 3, E.T.S.R., and S½ lot 26, con. 5; W½ lot 27, con. 6, and the easterly three rods of the northerly 20 rods of lot 27, con. 5.—Carried.

Howey - Carbert—That the Road Superintendent's Pay Sheet No. 4, for the sum of \$300.50, be paid and the Treasurer be instructed to issue cheques for the same.—Carried.

Mr. Price presented Report No. 6 of Finance Committee, recommending payment of \$336.58.

Howey - Carbert—That Report 6 of Finance Committee be adopted as read.—Carried.

Council then adjourned until the second of July at one o'clock.
