Live Stock Market

With very close to 7,000 cattle arriving for the opening market of the week, prices held steady to strong, especially for cattle of choice quality. Over half the offering consisted of stockers and feeders and the balance was mostly of medium quality cattle with a few loads of choice weighty steers which sold from \$10.00 to \$15.00 higher than a week ago. There was a good inquiry for stockers and feeders which changed hands at good prices. The cow trade was inclined to be a shade easier excepting for a few extra choice cows which held steady. The bulk of the choice weighty steers made from 6½ to 8.75, fair to good from 5½ to 6½. Choice butchers were in good demand at from 5 to 5½, fair to good from 4¼ to 5 cents, common and medium 3½ to 4, boners from 3 to 3¼. Choice baby heaves sold readily from 7 to

8½, others at lower prices according to quality. Choice light stockers ranged from 4 to 4½ and good feeders weighing from 900 to 1,000 at from 4¼ to 5¼. Choice cows sold at from 3½ to 3¾, fair to good from 2¾ to 3¼, common and medium 2¼ to 2¾, canners and cutters 1½ to 2. The bull trade was active and steady, bolognas selling mostly at 3 cents and choice butcher bulls at from 3¼ to 3¾.

Supplies of lambs were light for this time of the year and prices held steady with best ewes making 6½ and bucks 5½. The sheep trade was firm, light butcher sheep from 2½ to 3. All classes of calves held active and strong, choice light veal calves selling from 7½ to 8½, fair to good from 6¾ to 7½, common and medium 5½ to 6½, grass calves 4 cents.

Although early bids for hogs were lower on Monday, salesmen held out for steady prices and Tuesday the market was stronger, truck hogs selling at from 8.75 to 8.90. It is expected prices will hold steady for the balance of the week.
