Live Stock Market

Monday's fresh supply of cattle as the lightest run for some time. comprising about 3000 head. Besides this there were about 700 cattle left unsold, which consisted mostly of common stockers.

On Monday the market opened with a good demand for choice handy-weight butchers and baby beeves, also choice steers weighing from 1100 to 1200 lbs., which sold at from 6 to 614 c: fair to good from 5½ to 5%c; common and medium to 5c. Choice butcher steers and heifers made from 5 to 5 1/2 c; fair to good from 414 to 5c; common and medium 3½ to 4c. Choice baby beeves ranged from 7 to Sc; fair to good from 5 to 614c. There was a limited demand for stockers and feeders. Those of selected quality sold at steady prices, but common and medium were very slow of sale and lower. Choice selected stockers sold at from 414 to 436., and best feeders from 434 to 5c; common and medium from 314 to 4c. The ow trade was active and higher, choice butcher cows making from to 3.40; canners and cutters strong mostly 3c.

The lamb market displayed much activity, prices advancing on Monday to 9c for good ewes and wethers bucks discounted \$1.00. The market continued strong Tuesday, some of the best lambs making 9 1/4 c; also some fancy Christmas offerings up to 10c. All classes of sheep were in good demand, choice ewes selling at from 4 to 5c. The calf trade held active and steady, choice from 9 to 10c; fair to good from 7 to 81/2c; common and medium 51/2 to 61/2c.

Supplies of hogs were liberal and although prices were expected to adrance, the market finally settled on the basis of 7.50 f.o.b. and from 7.85 to 8.00 for truck deliveries. It is expected the market will hold for the balance of the week.


