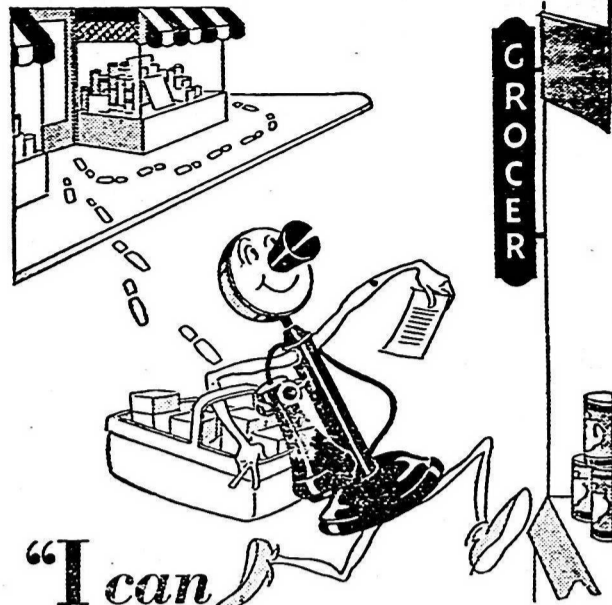
Making maple syrup is the order of the day.
