Miss Muriel Harvey is spending a week or so with Mrs. Cecil Williamson at Beaverdale.

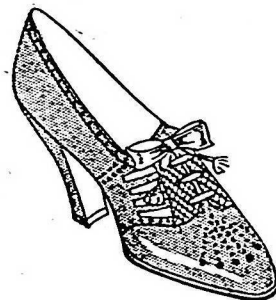
