

#### Mrs. A. R. Fawcett Died at Burks Falls

There was laid to rest in the Union Cemetery here on Tuesday, the mor-tal remains of Mrs. A. R. Fawcett, who died Sunday at her home in Burks Falls. Rev. E. Osborn of St. Paul's Presbyterian church had charge of the commitment service The late Mrs. Fawcett was the second wife of the former publishers of "The Review-Herald", the paper's name originating in his regime. To the first marriage of Mr. Fawcett there were born three children, Vers Howard and Robert. was a lieutenant in the 4th battalion, made the supreme sacrifice at Vimy

The late A. R. Fawcett's business life was devoted to journalism in which he had an extensive career He founded the Flesherton 'Advance over 50 years ago, selling out to the present owner, Mr. W. H. Thurston After a short time in Streetsville, he conducted a tri-weekly at Toronto Junction, leaving that centre in 1905 to take over "The Arrow" newspaper of Burks Falls, which he operated until his death in 1929. While with the Arrow" he branched out to buy the "Clarksburg Review" from E. Johnston and amalgamated with it the Thornbury "Herald-Reflector" into the present "Review-Herald", this change happening just prior to the 1914-1918 rar .- Thornbury R.-H.

#### Live Stock Market Report

(By Dunn & Levack, Toronto)

Supplies of cattle were heavy for Monday, comprising almost 5000 With a good demand cattle of good to choice quality held active and steady, while the unfinished class sold at a discount. Export buyers were again active in securing a large number of cattle for overseas shipments and this proved to be a real stimulant to the market as a whole.

Choice heavy steers ranged from 5.50 to 5.75 with a few top sales up to six cents; good to choice from 5.25 to 5.50; medium 4.75 to 5.00. Choice butcher cattle brought from 5.00 to 5.25; fair to good 4.50 to 4.90; common and medium 3.50 to 4.25. Baby beeves were in strong demand from six to seven cents with the best light kind at from 3.25 to 3.75, and feeders around 4.00 to 4.25. The cow market held active TORONTO - HAMILTON and strong with choice at 3.40 to 3.50: fair to good 3.00 to 3.25; medium 2.50 to 2.75; canners and cutters 1.75 to 2.25. Bulls were slow of sale from 3.00 to 3.25.

The lamb market held active and strong on Monday and Tuesday. Choice ewes were nine cents and the bucks eight cents. Best light sheep The calf market were 2.50 to 3.00. opened strong but on receipt of information to the effect that the quota had been filled for shipment of calves to the United States at the reduced rate of duty the market re acted and closed from 50 cents to 1.00 lower. Choice calves were 7.00; fair to good 6.00 to 6.50; common and medium 5.00 to 6.00; grass calves 3.50.
