### Miss Macphail Spoke of Conditions in Russia

Under the auspices of Cooke's resbyterian Woman's Association. Miss Agnes Macphail, M. P., spoke in the Orange Hall, here, Tuesday night and gave a most interesting and informative account of her recent trip to Russie, where she spent twelve days sightseeing and looking into conditions under the Soviet re-

The account of the trip by train from Finland to Leningrad was rather amusings, when one did not have to share the rather unconrential arrangement ments, wherein no distinction was made between men and women in alloting them In Russia she found much to admire and also much to doplore. The people, however, are in dead earnest and anxious to learn. As yet they have no time for the niceties of life. All is work, work -building, widening streets and all sorts of public works.

Leningrad, with a population of 3,000,000, is a beautiful city, with vide streets, electrically lighted and with trolley busses instead of street Wooden buildings are all attractively painted in bright colors, but the people are rather poorly In fact they do not know dressed how to dress well and seem to have no innate pride in being neat in appearance. There are no good shopping centres, although there are plenty of stores. Clothing is very expensive. Merchants do not appear ot have yet learned the art of window dressing. The streets, busses and stores are always crowded with people. There were some fine large hotels, but the service was much inferier to that of Britain and Canada. about two hours being required to get dinner served.

With others of her party, Miss Macphail visited hospitals and clinics, where they were required to remove their hats, gloves, etc., and put on white uniforms before being taken through the wards. baby clinic, children are cared for antil four years of age, and mothers for four months The standard of dress of the nurses and doctors is not as high as it might be, but they appeared to be doing good

In Moscow thewe was a terrific roar of building, factories, public buildings, underground railways and chools being erected Last year 34 large schools were built and equipped in the city. The very old and the very modern are elbowing each other everywhere. Parks of "Culture Dates of Grey County and Rest" are provided with all sorts of things to amuse the young, teach- School Fairs ers provided to give training to older childre nand experts to teach and lecture for the education of adults The government is very liberal in the matter of education and will provide educational facilities to the limit for anyone who is anxious to learn, but when they graduate they must use their knowledge for the good of the people.

The working day in Russia is seven hours hours and both men and women work. There is no distinction made in the matter of sex. Ability to do the work is the stand-ard on which they are engaged. and Adjoining Counties men of street construction or of load In the factories or out ing cars. they work side by side with the men not expecting, nor receiving, favour as to light jobs.

All land and natural resources be lon gto the state. Almost all farms are what is called collective farms of 2,500 acres, to which 240 families are allotted, averaging about 10 acres to each family. All, both men and women, are divided into ten brigades to work these farms. They are paid on the basis of work performed and of the quality of the work done. Although the people no longer own their farms, they are permitted a "deed of use" of land alloted to them. Modern machinery is used on these collective farms. Farming conditions are infinitely improved during the past few years, and the people appear to be well fed and on the whole contented and optimistic.
