Power From Small Spring

On the outskirts of the little village of Wellesley, on the southern boundary of that township, there lies one of the most ingenious devices to increase water power probably to be found in the province.

The water of a small spring on the top of a hill, about fifty feet above

the level, is deflected into a small hand-dug reservoir by means of a ditch. It is from this supply tank the water is drawn by the, rather than the usual race, and permitted to drop twenty-four feet on the turbines. By the length of the drop they are enabled to develop twenty-four horsepower with a stream of water that in an ordinary race would

not turn a grindstone. Man's ingenuity however, permits the operation of a fine machine shop, apple-butter and cider from the tiny stream of water.
