RITE-GOOD PICKLES

Soak large cucumbers in cold water 5 hours, cut lengthwise (without peeling) into 3 or 4 pieces, pack in quart fruit jars with 3 stalks of celery and 3 small onions in each jar. Drain off any juice after packing. Heat 1 quart cidar vinegar, 1 cup sugar, ½ cup water and 1|3 cup of salt. When boiling pour over cucumbers and seal at once. These can be used in one month.
