Miss Millie McMullen has returned to resume her duties in Toronto after spending the festive season with her mother here.

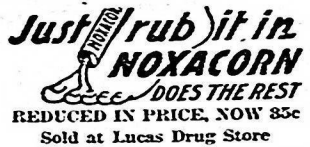
