Restricted Area Campaign

Throughout Grey County the greatest interest is being taken in the Restricted Area Campaign now being carried on. Approximately one ball of the county has been covered the first time. Exceptionally large meetings were held at Vandeleur, Barksburg, Ravenna, Meaford, Bogner, Mount Pleasant School, Owen Sand, Kilsyth, Annan, Desboro and Derham. Not quite so many were present at Wolseley and Allan Park. They varied from 42 to 86.

The chief objections offered were: I. That farmers would lose many eattle which might make it difficult. Such objection is without foun-

fation, because the farmers will get sufficient to replenish their herds, because the compensation received and the sale of the animal will recoup the loss.

Moreover, it is not expected the total losses will amount to more than 3 to 5% in Grey County. Farmers have this Restricted Polby in 14 counties now and none have as yet been put off their tarnis.

2. Difficult and expensive clean**pp** required.

Such again is foundationless Farmers can do all the work of scraping and whitewashing themgelves. They need not have one cent of outlay except for lime and a little disinfectant.
