FISH CHOWDER

1½ Pounds of fresh fish (cod, haddock or other fish)

2 Cupfuls of diced potatoes

1 Cupful of diced carrots

4 Cupful of diced carrots

4 Cupful of salt pork, diced

1 Medium onion, chopped

2 Tablespon milk

Sult and pepper to taste

Sult and pepper to taste

Emper the skin and bone from the fish and cut into small picces. Cook the fish, the diced potatoes and the carrots in the water for 15 minutes. Fry the salt pook until crisp, remove the picces and cook the onion in the fat until tender. Add the flour, stir until well blended and gradually add the milk, stirring until the mixture is smooth and thick. Combine this mixture with the 5th and vegetables, season to taste with salt and pepper, simmer for about 10 minutes, stirring frequently and serve bot.
