GREEN TOMATO PICKLE
 8 lbs. green tomatoes, chopped fine or put through meat chopper
 4 lbs. yellow sugar
 Boil 3 three hours and add
 1 quart vinegar
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 1 teaspoon mace
 1 teaspoon cloves
 Boil 15 minutes and let cool before putting in the bottles.

PLAIN DOUGHNUTS
 2 tablespoons shortening
 1 cup white sugar
 2 eggs
 1 cup milk
 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg
 3 teaspoons baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 3 3/4 cups sifted flour
 To shortening add half of sugar and cream slightly. Beat eggs into mixture, then add remaining sugar and milk. Add nutmeg, baking

powder and salt to 3 cups sifted flour. Sift again and mix thoroughly. Add to first mixture with remaining 3/4 cup flour to make a soft dough. Roll into 1/3 inch thickness, shape with cutter, fry in deep fat (360-370 Degrees F.) for 3 minutes, turning as soon as they are well browned on under side.

 1 small lb. flour
 Beat butter to a cream, and add sugar, then beaten yolks of eggs; add 1/4 of the flour, then beaten whites of eggs. Add another 1/4 of the flour and all the fruit and coffee. Then add balance of flour, (2 cups).
