Mr. Ralph Watson of Peterboro was home for a few days.

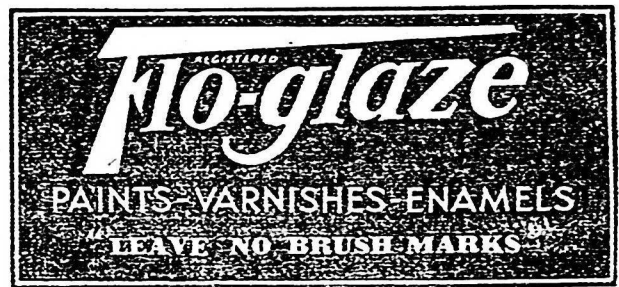
