Recipes for Standard's Cook Book

TEA CAKE
2 eggs
2 small cups sugar
½ cup sweet cream
1 cup shortening
5½ cups flour
1½ teaspoons soda
1½ teaspoons cream of tartar
¼ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla or lemon
Cream together sugar and shortening, add beaten eggs, cream and flavoring. Sift together the flour, soda, cream of tartar and salt. Mix together and roll out about ¼ inch thick and bake in hot oven.

SALMON LOAF
1 lb. can of salmon
2 cups cracker crumbs
2 eggs
6 tablespoons sweet milk
salt and pepper to taste
Remove bones from salmon and break into small pieces. Add well beaten eggs and cracker crumbs. Bake in buttered dish 20 minutes.

LEMON PIE
Juice of 2 lemons
2 cups white sugar
yolks of 3 eggs
4 tablespoons corn starch
butter size of egg
Stir all together with a little cold water. Add 3 cups boiling water and bring to a boil. Remove from stove and put in baked crusts. (2 pies.)
Beat egg whites to stiff froth. Add sugar. Spread on top of pies. Then brown in oven.

JELLY CUSTARD WHIP
2 cups rich milk or cream
4 tablespoons sugar
3 eggs
chopped nuts
small glass of fruit jelly (grape or strawberry)
Make a soft custard of milk, sugar, 1 whole egg beaten and the beaten yolks of two. A small amount of finely chopped nuts may be stirred in when cooked. Put into 6 sherbet glasses and let cool. Put a small glass of fruit jelly into a large bowl and beat with Dover egg beater. Add the stiffly beaten whites of two eggs. Then beat the whole until stiff. Pile this on the custard in the glasses. A few bits of jelly may be saved for a garnish.
