JELLY CUSTARD WHIP

2 cups rich milk or cream 4 tablespoons sugar

3 eggs

chopped nuts small glass of fruit jelly (grape or trawberry)

Make a soft custard of milk, sugar whole egg beaten and the beaten yolks of two. A small amount of finely chopped nuts may be stirred n when cooked. Put into 6 sherbet glasses and let cool. Put a small glass of fruit jelly into a large bow and beat with Dover egg beater. Add the stiffly beaten whites of two eggs. Then beat the whole until stiff. Pile this on the custard in the glasses. A few bits of jelly may be saved for a garnish.
