## Freak Fox Skins At Alberta Farm

Golden-Silver Pelts to be Sent to Paris For Exhibition

Parisian women will decide whether the "golden-silver" pelts of two 'freak' foxes bred in Alberta are worthy of adoption as a new style for the smartly dressed woman.

The pelts were shown to members of the Alberta Silver Fox Breeders' Association at their annual meeting here. Called golden silvers by some experts, the pelts were exhibited by William Clarke Blackfalds, Alta., on whose farms they were raised.

The golden silvers were a mystery even to the owner who could not explain how the peculiar strain developed. The pelts will be sent to Paris for exhibition.

## Australia Is Our Third Best Buyer

For the Past Seven Years—26,000 Automobiles Shipped There From Canada

Australia for the past seven years has been Canada's third best customer, according to L. R. Macgregor, Australian Trade Commissioner who spoke in Ottawa last week.

Mr. Macgregor stated trade between the Dominion and Australia was three to one in Canada's favor.

It was pointed out that Canadians and Australians had much in common, linked together as they were by ties of blood and race. Australia imported approximately 225,000,000 feet of softwood lumber from Canada during the past fiscal year, together with 178,000 tons of newsprint and large quantities of canned fish.

Among the products taken by Canada from Australia, raisins, canned fruit and raw sugar were listed, with four million pounds of wool.

With reference to Canadian exports to Australia, Mr. Macgregor stated 26,000 automobiles shipped in parts from the Dominion were assembled at plants in Australia.

## Agriculture Is Our Forgotten Industry

Rowell Probe Is Told That Aid Was Lacking For It

Canada did less to assist its agricultural industry from the ravages of price decline during the depression than any other country, Premier John Bracken of Manitoba claimed before the royal commission on Dominion-provincial relations at Winnipeg.

When the measures taken to aid Canadian agriculture were compared to those which other countries gave their wheat producers, "we can reach no other conclusion than that agriculture is Canada's forgotten industry," Mr. Bracken contended.

Chairman N. W. Rowell took exception to the word "forgotten."

"The head of the government of Canada in those years was a man from Western Canada, familiar with western problems and the interests of agriculture," Mr. Rowell stated. "I cannot but think he was concerned with the welfare of Western Canada and all the provinces and that he did what he thought was in the interest of the nation as a whole."

"I had much to do with the Dominion Government of that time and can subscribe 100 per cent to what has just been said," commented Mr. Bracken.

## Says Human Race Is Slipping Back

Evolutionist Sees Peril of Man "Reverting to Apedon"

Dr. Ernest A. Hooton, Harvard's famous evolutionist and anthropologist, last week at New York asserted that man was in danger of reverting to apedon and said the skills for his destruction had been built largely by engineering.

Stop The Down-Rush Dr. Hooton said this in the guest address to the annual meeting of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers. He called on the engineers to divert some of their high creative intelligence to stopping the down-rush.

Through scores of thousands of years, Dr. Hooton asserted, man kept his mechanical progress in abeyance by killing off the geniuses and superior intelligences who threatened to interfere with the status quo.

In the last 10,000 years, however, the masses have permitted the engineer to live, he said, and nearly the whole human mechanical progress has taken place. But lately, Dr. Hooton observed, the effects of this progress on the human body itself have become "devastating."

"Crouching" Again "The once erectly striding biped," Dr. Hooton said, "abandons human locomotion and whizzes through the landscape, crouched over wheels and levers worked by his still prehensile hands, and his flat, vestigial feet, no less useful for this purpose than those of his simian ancestors."

"He breathes a mixture of gasoline fumes and carbon monoxide and reeks of evolutionary decay. A premium is put upon illiteracy by the radio and the talking moving picture, and all our mechanical marvels pandering to the tastes of those who are capable of neither contriving nor understanding but only of crude perception, stimulated by turning a switch or pressing a button—motor performances without the capacity of a lemur.

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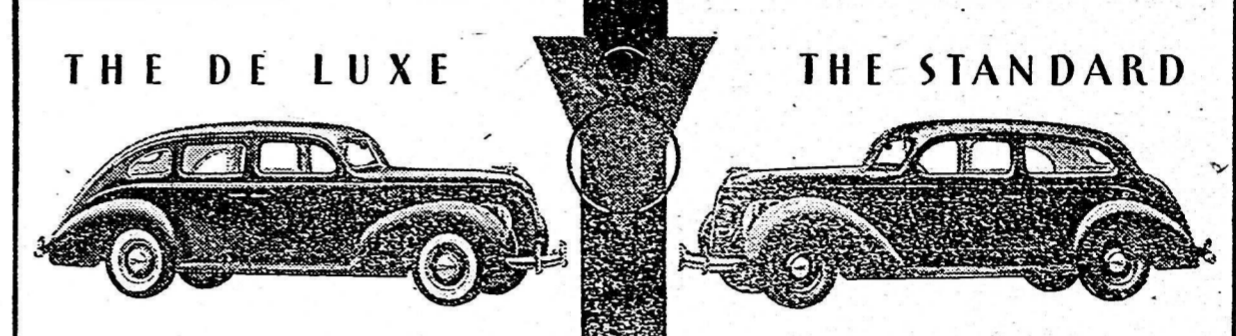
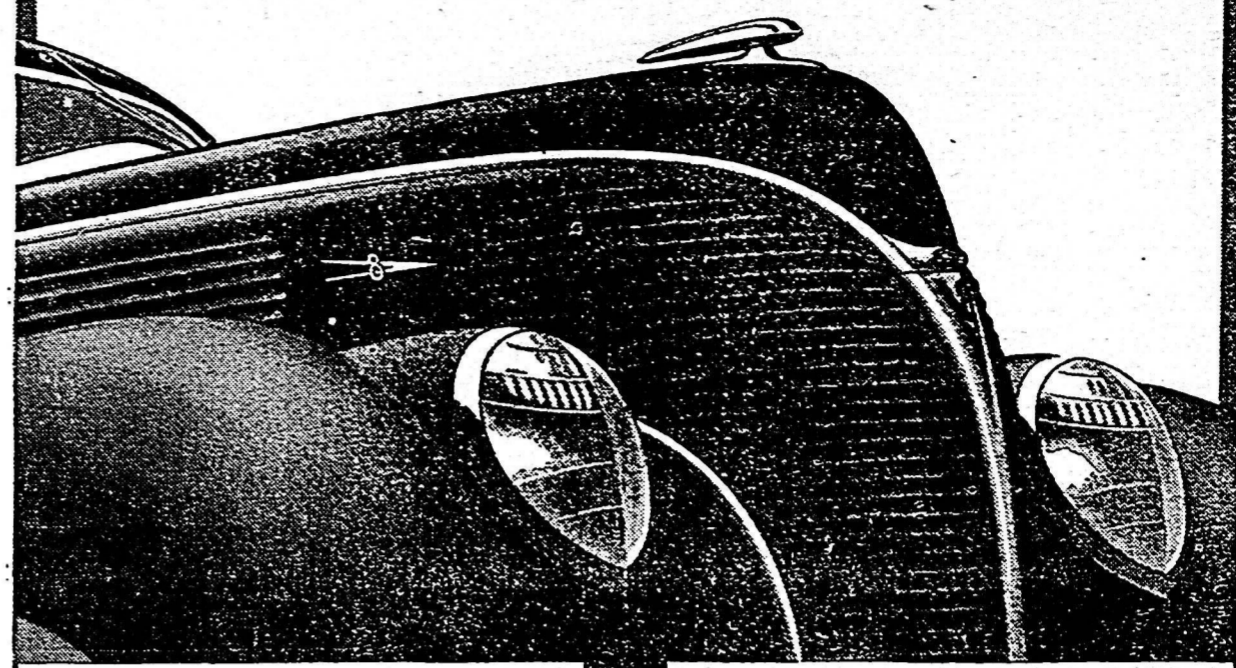

## OLD THEORIES OF SOUND DISPROVED BY EXPERIMENT

Extra Note Heard When Two Tones Are Struck Is Held Real

One of the great controversies of science, whether the extra note which human ears always hear when listening to two simultaneous sounds is real, or exists only in the ear, has been solved by Indiana University physicists.

Textbooks teach that the extra note is real. The books are wrong, for sometimes the sound is real and at others the human ear manufactures it. The Indiana experiments prove that man's ears work just like radio stations.

Siren Sounds The controversy dates to about 1870 when the German scientist, Hermann Ludwig Ferdinand von Helmholtz, sounded two notes simultaneously on a siren. Nearby some bell-shaped instruments picked up the two notes from the air vibrations. They gave off the same siren sounds.

But some of the receiving "bells" also vibrated with a third note, different from either of the siren notes. There was no doubt that this third note was real—that it travelled in the form of air waves, set up by the two siren sounds.

Called "Beat Note" This third sound was clearly audible to the ear. It was what is commonly called a "beat note."

Then another German, Koenig, who lived in Paris and made tuning forks proved just as positively that von Helmholtz was wrong. He made two sounds with two tuning forks. The ear heard a third note. But no tuning fork ever picked up a third note. It was not real.

Scientists could not reconcile the two experiments. But so great was the fame of the theory of sound, that science concluded that Koenig was undoubtedly wrong.

Professor Hazel at Indiana has spent five years unravelling the mystery. He proved that when two separate instruments make the sounds, the extra note is not real. When the same instrument makes them, it is real. Explained more scientifically,

## Francis Drake Biggest Pirate

Interpretation of Celebrated Seaman Slightly Different From Cut-and-Dried History.

Sir Francis Drake's disregard for the gallantry of Spain was lauded by Gordon L. Fraser, K.C. when he spoke to members of the Windsor Optimist Club last week, says the Windsor Star.

"I never thought much of it," remarked Mr. Fraser after telling how the famous English seaman had crumpled the gallantry of the Spaniards.

"They are murdering each other now in Spain and maybe they should let them finish it," he added.

After referring to the recent piracy in the Mediterranean, he told of the one he considered to have been the greatest pirate in history, Sir Francis Drake.

Endorsed Him Privately Mr. Fraser's interpretation of the career of Drake was far from the cut and dried school-history version. His clever and humorous tongue painted a word picture of the Elizabethan favorite to match his contention that Drake was one of the most colorful figures in the history of the world.

The speaker recalled in detail the series of expeditions conducted by Drake and his men, featuring the one that took them around the world.
