

## Two Dead as Result of Auto-Truck Crash on Highway 10

### MISS EUGENE GRAHAM AND MR. BERT GRAHAM OF EUGENIA FATALLY INJURED MONDAY

As a result of a collision between an auto and a transport near Shelburne on Monday, Miss Eugene Graham and her brother, Mr. Bert Graham, and her father, Mr. Charles Graham, are dead. Miss Graham passed away shortly after arriving at the hospital in Orangeville and Mr. Graham died in the same hospital early on Wednesday morning.

The accident occurred on the open highway and it is thought was caused by the ice on the road, but eyewitnesses state that something must have happened to the Graham car as it is said to have swerved across the road just prior to the accident.

The sad occurrence has cast a gloom over the whole district, where the Grahams are well known and highly respected. The funeral of Miss Graham took place on Wednesday at Markdale cemetery with service in the United Church at Eugenia.

Rotarian Das Mercer gave his Classification speech last Thursday at the Club luncheon on the subject of Rayon—the history of its development and its place in Canadian industry.

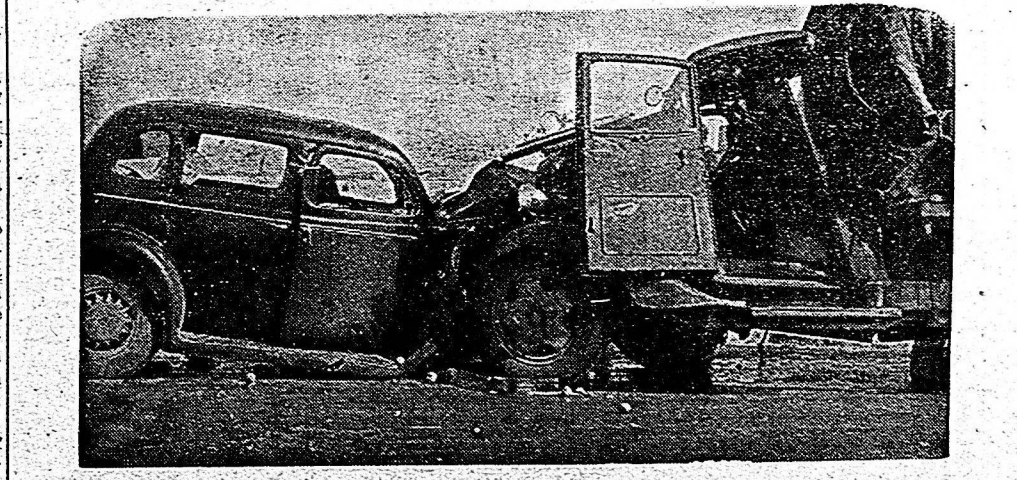
