## VANDELEUR

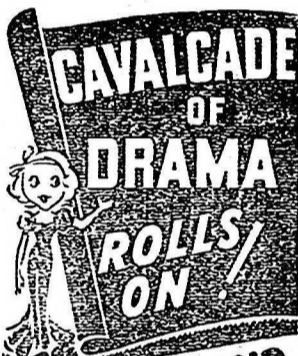
