Miller - Postage - That this Council pay election expenses amounting to \$101.00. - Carried.

Lee - Miller - That the following telephone levies be paid: J. D. Crabtree, St. Vincent Telephone levy, \$1279.76; C. Fothergill, Euphrasia Telephone levy, \$1561.88; R. J. Heslip, Beaver Valley Telephone levy, \$5900.51. - Carried.

Postage - Caswell - That the following relief bills be paid: J. W. Clarke, relief to Susan Cudney, \$10.00; Russell Ellis, relief to Jas. Mundle, \$5.00; Mrs. S. Saunders, relief to Sheppard family, \$20.75; Mrs. G. Caswell, relief to Sheppard family, \$2.00; Wm. Lanktree, relief to Sheppard family, \$2.40. - Carried.

Lee - Caswell - That this Council purchase Treasurer's bond for \$5000.00 from Globe Indemnity Co., through S. Saunders at a premium of \$20.00 per year. - Carried.

Lee - Caswell - That this Council pay Gordon Rodgers the sum of \$500.00 as settlement for damages as per letter of December 10, 1940, cheque to be issued to Rodgers and sent to his solicitor. - Carried.

Live stock claims were received from the valuers as follows and payment authorized: Victor Hansen, 1 sheep killed, \$7.00; Morrell Crawford, 1 lamb killed, \$9.50; Bert Hamilton, 1 lamb killed, \$8.00.

Sutcliffe - Buchanan - That Charles Tebbutt receive the sum of \$22.95 refund of taxes owing to loss of building by fire. - Carried. Buchanan - Dixon - That the Treasurer receive the sum of \$20.95 from the County of Grey, same being proceeds of sale of land as follows: lot 44, con. 1, W.T.S.R., \$10.48; lot 45, con. 1, W.T.S.R., \$10.47, total \$20.95. - Carried.

Dixon - Beirnes - That leave be granted to introduce a by-law governing the erection, location and maintenance of fences abutting on township roads. - Carried.

Leave granted and by-law read a first time. Sutcliffe - Beirnes - That the Treasurer accept \$2.50 from the caretaker, same being balance due from hall operation for preceding month. - Carried.

Buchanan - Dixon - That Archie Burrell be notified to pay at once the sum of \$14.00, said amount being 50% of sheep losses caused by dog owned by the said Mr. Burrell and that the remaining 50% be also charged to Mr. Burrell, as the Council feels that insufficient evidence has been presented to prove that a second dog was involved. - Carried.

Dixon - Buchanan - That the Clerk be instructed to convey to Mr. J. F. Hare the sincere good wishes from the Council and officials at this festive season and also to express the wish that he soon be restored to good health and that he may soon enjoy a speedy recovery from his illness. - Carried.

Dixon - Beirnes - That By-Law No. 137 governing the erection and maintenance of road fences in the township be now read a second time. - Carried.

Sutcliffe - Dixon - That By-Law No. 137 governing the erection and maintenance of road fences in the township be now read a third time, finally passed, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and engrossed in the By-Law book. - Carried.

Sutcliffe - Buchanan - That the Road Superintendent's Voucher No. 9, amounting to \$371.71, be passed and the Treasurer be authorized to issue cheques for the same. - Carried.

Sutcliffe - Buchanan - That Financial Statement No. 12, amounting to \$1,337.32 be passed and the Treasurer issue cheques for the same. - Carried.

On motion the Reeve then left the chair, when it was moved by Buchanan-Beirnes that this Council extend to our Reeve, Mr. George Hanna, our sincere appreciation and thanks for the efficient and impartial manner in which he has presided at our meetings during the year, and we join in wishing him and Mrs. Hanna a Merry Christmas and many Happy and Prosperous New Years. - Carried.

This motion was tentatively replied, after which all joined in the singing of the National Anthem and the Council adjourned "Sine Die".
