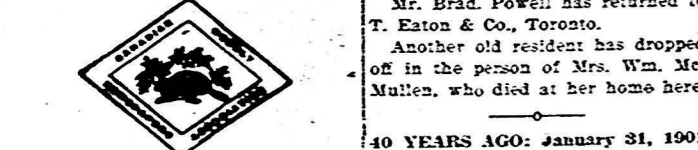

Messrs. Dick Wilcock and John Parker visited friends at Singhampton and Stayner on the week-end.

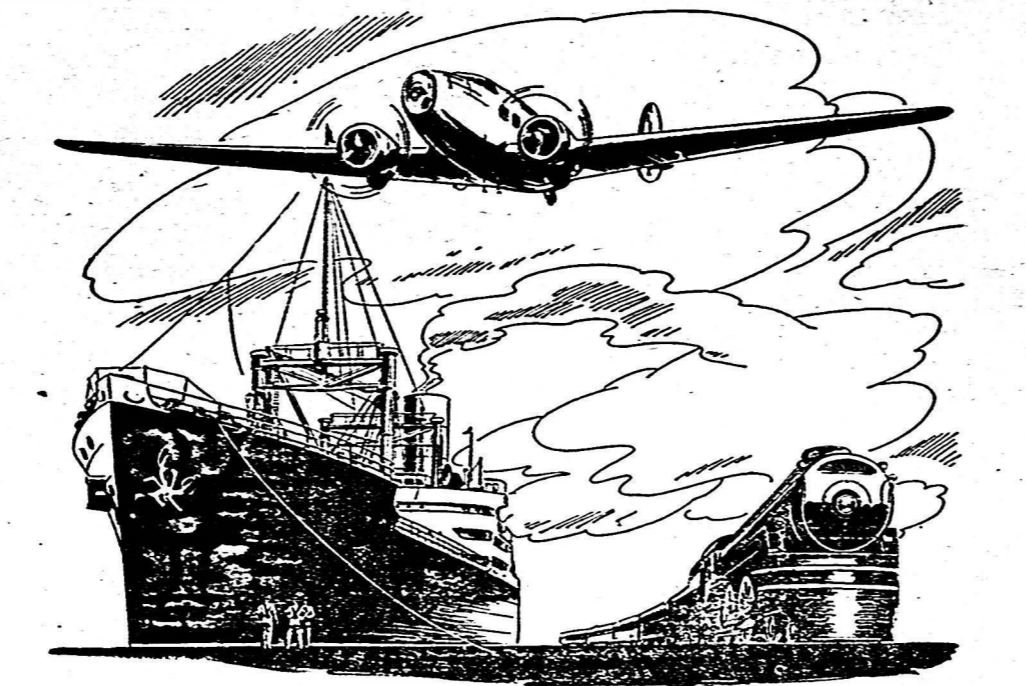
Miss Mabel Thistlethwaite left on Tuesday for Toronto to take a position in a wholesale millinery for a month prior to resuming her former position at Brighton.
