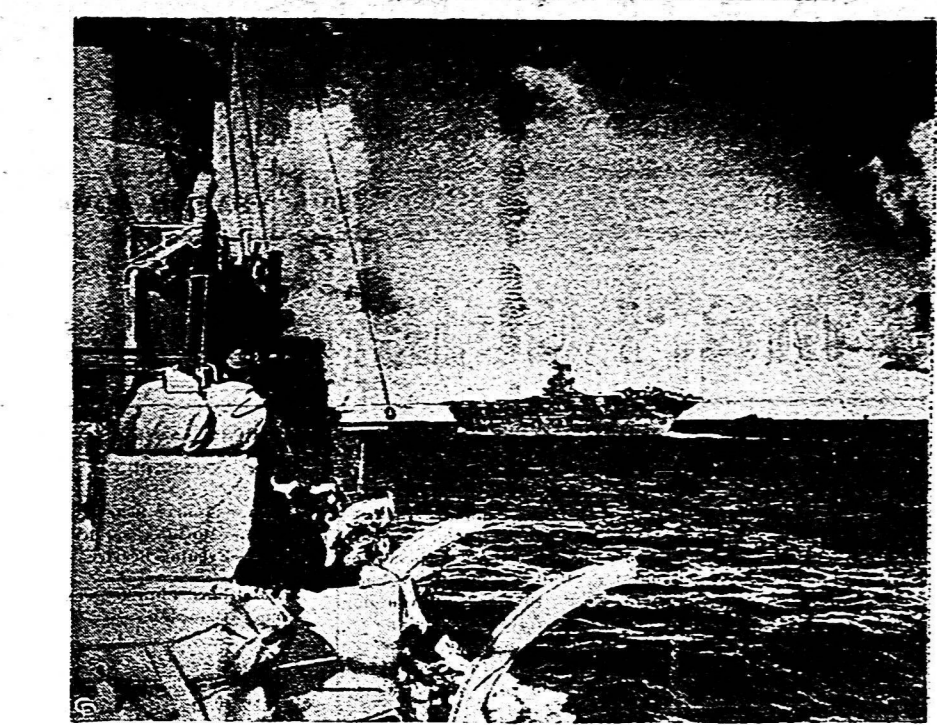


BRITISH KEEP UPPER HAND OVER "MARE NOSTRUM"

Dogs are killing approximately 10,000 sheep annually in this Province, Dr. G. I. Christie of the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, told the Ontario Sheep Breeders' Association at its annual convention.

He called on the breeders to consider some kind of program for the destruction of the dogs which are causing heavy damage. Killer dogs are the main factor acting against the increased production of sheep in the Province, he said.

Early Symptoms Of Tuberculosis

In an article written for "Health", the official organ of the Health League of Canada, short-handled Dr. W. S. McCullough defines the early symptoms of tuberculosis as follows:

Being too easily tired, Loss of weight, Irritability, and A cough that hangs on. Pleurisy may be one of the first signs of tuberculosis in adults, as may be a spitting of blood, however slight.

The tubercle bacillus is passed from person to person in various ways, Dr. McCullough points out. The consumptive who coughs with uncovered mouth sprays the air around him with the bacilli.

Care Required In Varnishing

Extreme care should be used in preparing and applying varnish. Never store varnish in a room where the temperature is usually low. 60 YEARS AGO A Charter was signed. On February 15, 1881, the Marquis of Lorne, then Governor-General of Canada, signed the charter of the Great Canadian Pacific Railway.
