The Vandeleur Girls' Club met at the home of Doreen Boland on Tuesday, May 20, when the mothers of the members were guests of honor.

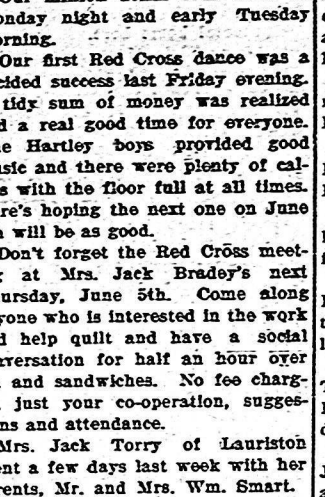
