HOLLAND TOWNSHIP COUNCIL MINUTES

Holland Centre, October 7th, 1941

Council met on the above date for the transaction of general business with all members of council present and Wilbert Sutcliffe, Reeve, presiding.

After Mr. Sutcliffe had taken the declaration of office as Reeve, and Mr. Howey the declaration as Deputy-Reeve the business of the meeting was proceeded with.

Minutes of previous meetings were read and confirmed. Several items of correspondence were read and dealt with. Hospital accounts to the total of \$32.50 were ordered paid. Relief accounts to the total of \$48.23 were presented and payment authorized.

Live stock claims as under were received from the valuers and payment authorized: Fred Stafford, per W. Aitken, 1 sheep killed, \$8.00; Morrell Crawford, 1 lamb killed, \$10.00.

Buchanan - Dixon—That the Treasurer receive the sum of \$1.30, rebate on bond cancellation for Tax Collector bond.—Carried.

Dixon - Buchanan—That the Clerk be instructed to issue orders on Treasurer for all accounts presented to date on Adam Holley trust account as authorized by the public trustee and that all available monies left from sum in Bank of Montreal to Adam Holley trust account be forwarded to the public trustee.—Carried.

Dixon - Howey—That the Reeve and Road Superintendent inspect narrow road on Townline Holland and Glenelg and make arrangements for widening at least some places this fall, also inspect portion of sideroad 80, west from highway 10.—Carried.

Buchanan - Belnes—That Road Superintendent's Voucher No. 10, amounting to \$293.63 be passed and Treasurer issue cheques for same.—Carried.

Buchanan - Belnes—That Finance Statement No. 10, amounting to \$324.41 be passed and the Treasurer be authorized to issue the cheques for same.—Carried.

Belnes - Buchanan—That we extend to Deputy-Reeve James Howey our heart felt sympathy in the loss of his father, the late Robert Howey. Mr. Howey was for years a member of this council, and had the distinguished honour of being the last Reeve of Holland Township to attain the high honour of being Warden of the County of Grey.—Carried.

Howey - Dixon—That the Red Cross grant received from the County of Grey be apportioned amongst the units of the township as follows: Berkeley, \$10.00; Walters Falls, \$10.00; Massie, \$10.00; Williamsford, \$10.00; Arnott, \$10.00; and Holland Centre and District Branch, \$50.00.—Carried.

Council then adjourned until Tuesday, November 4th, at one o'clock p.m.
