and a modest living allowance while
he completes his course. To receive
substantial benefits, and go a long
way toward placing a soldier back
where he started when he enlisted.

I shall not attempt at this time
to outline the measures which are
contemplated in order to extend the
scope of national selective service.
I shall confine myself to saying that
the extended policy of selective ser-
vice will comprehend measures to
increase the supply of man-power for
war industry and for the armed
forces; also measures to safeguard
and, where necessary, to assist in
providing agricultural labour.
