WHAT SCIENCE IS DOING

IMMERSION FOOT

Successful methods of preventing and treating a serious war ailment of shipwreck victims, immersion foot, have been developed by three Royal Canadian naval medical officers, the War Infor-mation Board of Canada aunounces

Of 150 survivors of torpedoed vessels they treated at an East-ern Canadian port, only seven re-quired amputation of the affected foot. By contrast, nearly all sur-vivors picked up by trawlers from one internationally known ship which was sunk in European wa-ters had to have their feet amputated.

Caused by Exposure

Immersion foot is caused usually by exposure in life rafts or boats for long periods and if not

properly treated is likely to result in gangrene, requiring amputation to save the victim's life.

The rules for prevention of the condition are: 1. Cover legs and feet with a thick coating of grease as long-distance swimmers do; 2. Remove any constricting clothing such as tight boots hich are in use for warmth if the feet are in water anyway; 3. Exercise the feet as much as possible, to keep

the blood circulating, as long as they are healthy. The great tragedy of many imnersion foot victims is that rescuers in giving treatment to survivors of ship sinkings usually give the wrong treatment which causes the patient intense suffering and even loss of one or both feet. Rubbing the feet and applying hot water bottles and blankets is exactly the wrong treatment.

First Aid Rules

First aid rules for this condition are: 1. Keep the patient dry and warm except for his feet; 2. Lightly dust sulfan lamide powder on any wounds, cuts or sores; 3. Wrap the legs in some soft clean material and elevate on pillows; 4. Leave further treatment for a doctor who should be seen as soon as possible. No washing, soaking, antiseptics, lotions or ointments, except the sulfanilamide powder, should be used. The patient must rot stand or walk, and his feet and legs must be handled gently. Survivors treated in the port

had their feet wrapped in sterile towls to keep them dry, and packed in ice, or kept under a blast of cool air from a fan, because the success of the treatment of immersion foot depends on bringing the affected parts back to normal temperature very slowly, over a period of weeks.

Fabrics From Milk

Carrier Pigeons Given Parachutes

Birds would not normally be expected to have parachutes, but the army is providing some for its carrier pigeons.

The pigeons are used with paratroopers who might land behind enemy lines and be unable to use radio to get necessary informa-tion back to their bases.

The birds are dropped either in special containers strapped to the soldiers' chests, or in cages at-tached to parachutes.

For hundreds of years the great military and naval leaders of the English-speaking race have been devout men, with a sublime faith in God and a firm belief in the ultimate triumph of right as the fulfilment of His will. It came as no great surprise, then, when Gen. no great surprise, then, such a spec-ial service of thanksgiving to be held Sunday, May 23, for his vic-torious British First Army in Tun-Isia, explaining:

When success comes our way. we are inclined to place too much emphasis on our own skill and power and not enough on the strength which comes from beyond human limits."

Those are words which might have been uttered by that fighting man of God. Gen. Sir Bernard Law Montgomery of the British Eighth Army, or by that other Covenanter. Gen. Thomas Jonathan Jack-son. C.S.A., who lived according to the New Testament and fought

according to the Old.

Washington and Lee humby asked for divine guidance on ev-ery occasion." Stonewall" Jackson ordered thanksgiving services after victory and never failed to give God the credit for his successes. 
