Q. How can I make a solution for cleaning woodwork?

A. Mix 1 cup of vinegar, 1 cup of kerosene, and 2 cups of warm water. This is excellent for washing enameled or painted woodwork or furniture, going woodwork or infinitely, going over a small portion at a time, then drying with a soft cleth. It will remove grease and dirt, leaving a nice glossy surfaces. Do not use on varnished surfaces. Q. How should paint brushes

Q. How can I bleach white silk


that has yellowed?

### WHAT SCIENCE IS DOING

More than 3,000,000 Amer cans, many in the prime of life, suffer from arthritis, one of the most prevalent chronic disabling diseases in that nation, as it also is in Canada, says The Stratford Beacon-Herald. But favorable esults obtained with a relatively new treatment of 250 cases the most crippling form of arthri-tis are reported in the current issue of Industrial Medicine by Drs. R. G. Snyder, Willard H. Squires and John W. Forster of the Hospital for Special Surgery, New York City.

The patients, subjects in a six year study, previously had failed to respond to the more common forms of therapy. Then they were given the new treatment—huge doses (from 200,000 to 300,000 units per day) of Vitamin D in the form of an electrically activated heat-vaporized ergosterol (Ertron is the trade name). Over extended periods the pa-

tients continued to take the cap-sules by mouth.

The article charts detailed effects of the vitamin treatment in 50 serious cases. On the basis of a check made from two to three years after the drug was first administered, results in 22 cases were good or excellent. re-sults in eight cases poor, and the rest either fair or undetermined because patients moved away. In some instances persons whose joints appeared hopelessly stiff-ened and swollen were able to resume their normal occupations one was able to play golf again another, a star tennis player who had been unable to rise from a

Repair Boats Carried In Sicily Invasion




