The Local Ration Board wishes thank all the volunteer workers who helped distribute ration book No. 3 each of the three distributing entres-Markdale, Flasherton and Dundalk. It was because of the splendid work done by each of the distribution was such a success. A total of \$70% books were distributed in the territory under the Loeal Ration Board. Of this number Markdale issued 2445, Flesherto 2359 and Dundalk 3902.

Farmers may obtain extra coup ons for all the ration foods if they have extra hired men but they must to such help. The application forms may be obtained from any of the local representatives of the Board. When these forms are properly filled in and signed, mail them to the Secretary at Flesherton.

All farmer operators of beef rings must collect the necessary meat coupons from each member of the beef ring at the time he delivers the meat.
