Flesherton Soldier Writes About Sicily

(Flesherton Advance)
The following passages are taken from a letter written by Spr. Emerson Thompson and received recently by Mrs. Thompson:

We landed (blocked out). It was a barren looking spot—a few buildings on a slope, stone fences and fields of large boulders. The scenery improved as we went inland and after going over the top of the hill it dropped straight off in places with bunches of prickly cactus here and there. It reminded me of pictures I'd seen of parts of Mexico. The valley was rather nice looking with gardens, vineyards, orchards of lemons, oranges, figs and grapes, all of which we enjoyed. Tomatoes, onions and garlic are plentiful.

I can't tell you much about the towns, as they are "out of bounds", and we only see a bit of them when passing through, but that is enough. The buildings are stone, the streets narrow with balconies out over them. Chickens, donkeys, goats, cats, dogs and people ramble up and down, and from appearances of some places, I think they all sleep together.

The farmers cut their grain with sickles and bind it by hand. The sheaves are brought in from the field tied to the sides of mules and ponies. Most of the threshing is done in a pit, the sheaves thrown in and a man stands in the centre and drives five or six horses and mules around in a circle. Then they start on the windward side and by throwing the straw into the air, the wind carries it a few feet and the grain falls down. They gradually work the straw all out.

The towns are mostly on high hills and the roads zig-zag to the top and down again. Sometimes you can look almost straight down a few hundred feet and see part of the convoy ahead going in the opposite direction. The drivers have to keep on the job or over we'd go. I don't drive but sit up behind the cab with a gun. First I had a rifle, but now a Bren gun.

We haven't been given permission to say where we are or date our letters, but Barbara will be a year old in just ten days. Let Jerry start figuring that one out. (Barbara's birthday was Aug. 15th).
The "C.M.F." added to the address means Central Mediterranean Force. I certainly wish you could have taken that cruise with me. It was really grand and very little enemy trouble. We are all fairly well pleased with this campaign, because it means that at last we are starting to work our way home. I hope to be with you before another summer.
