Holland Centre, March 21st, 1944

A special meeting of Holland Council was held in the Township Hall at Holland Centre on the above date for the purpose of considering applications for the position of Assessor. The members were all present and the Reeve, W. Sutcliffe, presided.

Buchanan - Dixon—That the resignation of Deputy-Reeve James Howey be accepted by this Council.—Carried.

Buchanan - Dixon—That leave be granted to introduce a by-law to appoint an Assessor for the Township of Holland. Leave granted and by-law introduced accordingly and numbered 159.

S. Howey - Buchanan—That By-Law No. 159 be now read a second time. By-Law read a second time.

By-Law No. 159 was considered in Committee of the Whole and referred back to Council.

Dixon - Buchanan—That By-Law No. 159 be now read a third time, finally passed, signed by the Reeve and Clerk and engrossed in the By-Law Book.—Carried.

S. Howey - Dixon—That the resignation of Mr. W. Buchanan as Councillor, be accepted.—Carried.
