Onions For Wounds

The aroma of fresh onions and garlie is such a good germ-killer that the Russians are using onions as an aid in curing infected The story is told in the Ameri-

can Review of Soviet Medicine, by B. Tokin, A Kovalenok, I. V. Toroptsev and A. G. Filatova.

They tested human mouths and found that after three to eight minutes of chewing fresh onions or garlic, and sometimes after one minute only, the mouths were found free of bacteria. The

Russians say they don't know what the chemical is that makes the breath lethal.

The killing effects disappear after about 16 minutes, but the punch, while it lasts, is tremen-dous. It kills not only the invisible germs, but the big visible protozoa. These are one-cell ani-

nale, like paramecia The killing, or healing, aroma are not confined to onions and garlic. The Russians report them lesser degree in horeradish radishes, peppers, and such fruits lemons, oranges and tange-

The wounds treated with onio were all amputations, of arms or legs. The onion was never place in or on the wound. A container was made to fif the wound, and carrying the vapors to it for 10 minutes in each treatment. The improvement was good enough that the Russians report they be-lieve the plant fumes have a place in treatment.
