Pattern of A World That Works

History is a cavalcade of empires that did not survive. Some have declined and fallen within our lifetime. Can our Commonwealth which has endured total war, remain united through the greater sacrifices and stresses of peace?

When the war is over, the battle for unity will go on. Ideas are on the march today, ideas of a master-race and a master-class. They grapple for the minds of the millions. Will these explosive ideas disrupt and destroy the Commonwealth? Or shall we match them with a fighting faith and a unity which springs not from words, but from a change of heart?

Such unity will come by change not by chance. "My idea of teamwork was limited," said a certain industrialist. "It consisted of doing what I wanted. I had to change." Our soundest contribution to the future of the Commonwealth will be a decision to build new teamwork in home and industry in this country.

On July 6th the last series of the rationing sugar coupons P1 to P10 are valid, each coupon being good for one pound of sugar. Preserve coupons may be used for the purchase of sugar each coupon worth 1/2 pound.

For replacement of lost ration books, or ration books for infants apply to your local ration centre at Markdale, Fiesherston or Dundalk for the necessary application forms. Application forms for extra rations for extra help on farms may also be had from your local representative.

Coupons now valid are: Butter 66-69, these will expire on July 31. Nos. 70 and 71 become valid on July 20th. Tea and coffee Nos. 14-29 and E1-E6 (ration book 3) and T30 to T36 (ration book 4).
