Politicians of every party are very free with their promises for a world which the boys overseas will be proud to return to and happy to live in. But none of them have shown just how this sort of world can be achieved. If you set out to build a world fit for the returning men, how would you begin?

Politicians, for the most part, pin their hopes to some sort of economic social or political planning. There is the Beveridge Report in England. And though none quite so famous, the Beveridge proposal has its counterparts in post-war planning here.
